# Resource Management & Conservation

## Soil & Water Cost Share Program

- A. Projects to improve efficiency and profitability while conserving on-farm natural resources
- B. Consultation and design in partnership with farmer, Soil Conservation District and USDA-NRCS
- C. 50% cost-share reimbursement for approved projects
- D. Average over \$1.1 million annually 2002 through 2005 for conservation projects

#### **Deed of Easement Protections**

- A. Requires farm conservation plan within one year of preservation
- **B.** No activity "detrimental to the continued agricultural use of the property" is permitted
