EQUINE OVERVIEW

“Equine service activities,” such as boarding and riding lessons, are permitted on preserved farms as ancillary to equine production activities on the farm, including pasturing, breeding, and hay production.

“Ancillary” means that the area of land on which equine service activities are conducted is subordinate, secondary, and auxiliary in comparison to the area of the farm devoted to equine production activities.

If equine service activities (such as boarding and riding lessons) on the property at the time of preservation were ancillary to equine-related production, then the said equine service activities would be deemed agricultural uses and not currently subject to the restrictions placed on non-agricultural uses in Paragraphs 3 and 4 of the Deed of Easement. If, in the future, equine service activities on the Premises are not “ancillary” as defined above, then the said activities would be deemed non-agricultural and would be subject to the restrictions contained in Paragraphs 3 and 4 of the Deed of Easement.

The areas occupied by equine service activities and equine production activities will be defined and attached as a Schedule to the Farmland Preservation Deed of Easement.
