BY THE BOARD:

By this Decision and Order, the Board considers South Jersey Gas Company's ("SJG" or "Company") request to change its natural gas distribution rates and charges pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, N.J.S.A. 48:2-21.1, and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12 to be effective on and after December 26, 2025 ("Petition").

## BACKGROUND AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On November 26, 2025, SJG filed the Petition seeking approval of an increase in its current base rates for natural gas service of approximately \$74.71 million, to be effective for service provided on and after December 26, 2025, but in no event later than September 1, 2026. The Company also seeks Board approval, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-18, to implement new depreciation rates. SJG requested a return on equity ("ROE") of 10.00%.

According to the Petition, the primary driver of the proposed rate increase is to provide the Company a reasonable opportunity to earn a fair return on the investments made, so that it can continue to invest in the infrastructure necessary to continue providing safe and reliable service to its customers. SJG indicated that its request for rate relief is also driven by a need to recover greater depreciation expense, as well as increases to its operations and maintenance costs

SJG also notified the Board that it reserves the right to implement the proposed rates on September 1, 2026, on an interim basis pursuant to law and Board regulations and policy, if the Board has suspended the effective date of new rates pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21 but not finally determined a just and reasonable rate prior to that date.

incurred by the Company since its last base rate case. According to SJG, without appropriate rate relief in this proceeding, allowing a reasonable return of and return on these investments, the Company would earn a 6.96% ROE for the test year ended March 31, 2026.

By the Petition, SJG further requested the following:

- 1) Approval of its proposed depreciation rates simultaneously with the effective date of the new rates resulting from this proceeding;
- 2) A finding that its Infrastructure-Investment-Program-related costs are prudent and authorization to roll those costs into base rates;
- 3) Continuation of the authority to establish regulatory assets for its Transmission Integrity Management Program and Transportation-Administration-Service-related costs;
- 4) Continuation of authority to defer costs related to:
  - a. Incremental pension and post-retirement healthcare expenses
  - b. The Company's Pipeline Integrity Management program;
- 5) Authority to create regulatory assets for:
  - Costs that would otherwise be expensed related to the Vineland Liquefied Natural Gas Project if it is determined that an impairment of these assets is required under Generally Accepted Accounting Principals
  - b. Operating costs associated with the Company's Utility Alignment Project;
- 6) Authority to amortize several regulatory assets and costs over a three (3)-year period, including:
  - a. Energy and Water Benchmarking of Commercial Buildings
  - b. Costs related to a proposal to incorporate non-pipes alternatives in its supply and demand planning;
  - c. Over-refunded amounts related to the Company's Excess Deferred Income Taxes
  - d. Costs related to the Petition, including the cost of legal and consultant expenses, newspaper notices, court reporting, postage, and other miscellaneous expenses.
- 7) Proposed tariff changes, including:
  - a. The renaming of the "delivery charge" to "distribution charge" for the Residential Service and General Service rate classes;
  - b. To change the calculation of the distribution charge such that it only includes base rates.

Because the proposed revisions, if approved, will likely increase existing rates and change or alter existing classifications in the SJG's tariff, the Board <u>HEREBY ORDERS</u> as follows:

- (1) Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21(d), and consistent with N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12, the proposed revisions are suspended until April 27, 2026, unless, prior to that date, the Board makes a determination disposing of the Petition or enters an Order further suspending the proposed revisions;
- (2) SJG shall, at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for hearing on the Petition by the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL"), file with this Board, and with the OAL, proof of compliance with the notice provisions of N.J.S.A. 48:2-32.2 and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12(b) and (c), which notice shall include a statement that any relief found by the Board to be just and reasonable may be allocated by the Board to any class or classes of customers on any rate or schedule as the Board may determine; and

(3) SJG shall serve copies of this Order upon the OAL, the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel, the clerk of each affected municipality, the clerk of the Boards of County Commissioners of each affected county, and, where appropriate, the executive officer of the affected county within its service area. Proof of service of this Order shall be filed with the Board.

This Order shall be effective on December 24, 2025.
