On October 6, 2021, the NJBPU approved the School and Small Business Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program Fund ("Fund") pursuant to L. 2021, c.200. The Fund supports two sub-programs. The School and Small Business Ventilation and Energy Efficiency Verification and Repair Program ("SSB-VEEVR") (75% of total funds) will provide grants to ensure that recipients have functional HVAC systems that are tested, adjusted, and, if necessary or cost effective, repaired, upgraded, or replaced to increase efficiency and performance. The School and Small Business Noncompliant Plumbing Fixture and Appliance Program ("SSB-NPFA") (25% of total funds) will provide grants for replacement of noncompliant plumbing fixtures and appliances with water-conserving plumbing fixtures and appliances.

Both programs are funded through \$180 million in federal funding made available through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

- 75% of funding under both programs is reserved for schools:
 - 75% to school districts located in underserved communities
 - o 25% to other school districts
- 25% of funding under both programs is reserved for small businesses:
 - 75% to small businesses located in underserved communities
 - 25% to other small businesses

The law defines an underserved community as a school district in which at least 75% of public school students are eligible to receive free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch Program.

Boards of Education include public schools, such as local school districts, consolidated school districts, regional school districts, county vocational schools, and charter schools.

Small businesses include New Jersey-based businesses that:

- Are independently owned and operated;
- Have no more than 100 full-time employees;
- Have annual gross revenues which do not exceed \$12 million; and
- Are certified by the State as women- or minority-owned businesses.²
