

FAQs from Medicinal Cannabis Operators on Using the Licensing Portal

On September 26, 2024, the NJ-CRC licensing portal will open to medicinal cannabis business operators. All 2025 renewals must be submitted in the portal by September 30, 2024.

- 1. Will we get any information via email, or do we have to go to website?

 A: Emails will be sent, and the information will also be on our website. Please ensure we have your correct email address on file, and that your mailbox is not full.
- 2. If I have more than one medicinal cannabis business license, will I need to upload materials for each one?

A: Yes. Each Medicinal license will require separate application materials to be uploaded.

- 3. When will the certification letter be emailed?
 - A: Click here to download Certification letter.
- 4. What documents are medicinal cannabis business operators required to upload?

 A: Current, approved documentation for Persons and Entities of Interest, business documents, standard operating procedures, and executed agreements.
- 5. If you start the application and save it, can you go back into the portal later and pick up where you left off?

A: Yes.

- 6. What is the maximum file size your system can handle on the upload?

 A: 10MB. You may break your file into smaller documents.
- 7. Can you please clarify the cost of each Medicinal license renewal? Is there an ATC permit renewal fee and if so, what is that cost?

A: The Medicinal permit renewal fee is \$20,000.00 per business, not per location.

8. What is the deadline for remitting payment? Can that be done via mail/check or is payment required to be submitted through the portal?

A: Businesses will have 30 days to pay once invoiced. Payment must be submitted through the portal.

What form of payment is accepted? ACH? Credit card?A: ACH only.

10. Could you clarify the passive investor inclusion via an attachment; specifically, do they need to be entered into the person of interest area in the portal?

A: Yes, the portal requires all Persons of Interest be uploaded to make sure the totality of owners in the portal equals 100% of the permit's ownership.

11. Are we going to have to do a separate application for each Medicinal license, in years past it was only one app that covered all our licenses as an ATC?

A: Yes. Each Medicinal Cannabis license will require separate application materials to be uploaded.

12. What if we're only submitting one application? Is it still invoiced later or pay at time of submittal?

A: All fees will be invoiced.

13. Just to be clear, we will only have between the 26th and 30th of September to submit our Medicinal license renewal?

A: That is correct.

14. Are Personal History Disclosure (PHD) forms needed for each owner?

A: Yes, we expect filing of PHDs for each owner.

15. We are an expanded ATC, does this submittal hold true for us or just Medicinal Cannabis Businesses? Is payment due on 9/30/24?

A: Alternative Treatment Centers (ATCs) <u>are</u> Medicinal Cannabis Permittees. Fees will be invoiced after 9/30/24 as the applications move through the approval process.

16. Can you clarify if the ATC permit renewal is separate from the Medicinal and adult-use renewals? If so, what is the cost for the ATC permit renewal?

A: The ATC permit renewal is the same as the Medicinal Cannabis Permit renewal. It operates on the calendar year. The adult-use renewal is separate.

17. Will the renewed licenses be available in the portal once approved?

A: Once approved by the Board, the renewed permits will be available for download through the portal.

18. Should the Medicinal Cannabis renewal certification form be completed by the person submitting the application or ownership?

The Medicinal Cannabis Renewal Certification can be completed by any individual authorized to correspond on behalf of the business.
