NJBAC Cannabis Training Academy Format

Classes (Level 1 - 3) is free and available online to all New Jersey residents ages 21+. Students can learn at their own pace. Courses are a mix of PowerPoint, video instruction, and supporting course material. Text scripts and audio files are available for each course/video. Spanish translation in progress.

NJBAC Cannabis Training Academy Format

Classes (4-10) are free and available online to New Jersey residents ages 21+ who self certify and attest that they may qualify as an "Impact Zone" applicant.

Qualifying as an "Impact Zone" applicant means one, or a combination of, the following:

- Student lives in an Impact Zone as designated by the CRC
- Student plans to locate their future cannabis business in an Impact Zone
- Student plans to hire employees from an Impact Zone

Self-certified students can attest to one of the three "Impact Zone" qualifications to be eligible to access all course levels of the Cannabis Training Academy.







NJ Cannabis Sales (Last 4 Quarters)















Permitting and Licensing Committee Report Medicinal Cannabis: Institutional Caregivers

The Permitting and Licensing Committee will lead policy discussions on implementing institutional caregivers.

- Last month, the committee met with the NJ Department of Health, the licensing agency for many of these institutions.
- The Committee has identified some legal hurdles that need to be resolved.
- Next steps:
 - 1. Address the legal concerns
 - 2. Continue stakeholder engagement, and
 - 3. Schedule private roundtable discussions.



Permitting and Licensing Committee Report Medicinal Cannabis: Institutional Caregivers

- Recommendation:
 - The Permitting and Licensing Committee recommends decisions related to language and policy regarding institutional caregivers be postponed until the completion of the outlined steps.



Consideration of award for Independent Study Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 24:6I-24(f)

EQUITY RECHTPRORY COMMISSION

Consideration of award for Independent Study Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 24:6I-24(f)

- NJ-CRC must contract a public research university to conduct an independent study of the Commission and its work
- The study must include a review of:
 - NJ-CRC's organization
 - NJ-CRC's regulation and enforcement activities
 - Overall effectiveness of NJ-CRC as a full-time entity
 - Whether the regulation and oversight of medicinal or adult-use cannabis could be managed more effectively through reorganization, consolidating it with the Department of Health or another Executive Branch department, making it a part-time Commission, or transferring some or all of its operations within the Executive Branch.



Summary

- NJ-CRC Audit Committee issued a Request for Information (RFI) on March 19, 2024, for a study of the Commission, as required by law.
- Under the statute, five (5) public research universities were eligible:
 - Rutgers University; Rowan University; the New Jersey Institute of Technology; Montclair State University; and Kean University.
- Eligible institutions could submit questions by **April 8**, which was extended to **April 15**.
- The Committee received 28 questions and subsequently provided responses by **May 10.**
- Final proposals were due by **June 7**; three were submitted. Two eligible institutions did not submit.




