





# **Cannabis Equity Grant Programs**

## Overview

The Cannabis Equity Grant Program was a \$20 million pilot program that is open New Jersey recreational cannabis license holders for their start up and operational costs during their first three years of operation.

The **Joint Ventures Grant** awarded \$250,000 grants to cannabis businesses that had site control and municipal approval.

The **Seed Equity Grant** awarded \$150,000 grants to New Jersey recreational cannabis license holders, annual and conditional. Awardees also completed a technical assistance program to assist them with opening their business.




## Overview



## **Joint Ventures Grant**

- 40% set-aside for social equity applicants
- 5% set-aside for Impact Zones.
- Site control and municipal approval required
- Leadership/educational requirements
- Tax Clearance Certificate required
- Business must be formed before March 9, 2020
- Conditional or annual license required
- Less than 50 FT employees



## Joint Ventures Applicant Pool

#### **Applicant Overview**

### Joint Ventures Applicant Breakdown (Self-Reported):

- 163 applications submitted
- 91 applications Minority-Owned Business Enterprises (56%)
- 72 applications Woman-Owned Business Enterprises (44%)
- 43 applications were both Minority and Woman-Owned Business Enterprises (26%)

#### **Breakdown by County**

• Joint Ventures County Breakdown: Out of 163 applications, submissions were received from all 21 counties.



## **Joint Ventures Outcomes**

# **Seed Equity Grant**

- Awarded to social equity applicants only.
- 5% set-aside for Impact Zones.
- Applicants needed to meet leadership/educational requirements.
- Tax clearance at time of application.
- Business formed before March 9, 2020.
- NJCRC Conditional or annual license
- Less than 50 FT employees
- Grantees were required to complete a technical assistance program.





# Cannabis Technical Assistance Program

Developed in partnership
with Oaksterdam University, a pioneering
national leader in cannabis education,
and selected through a competitive public
bidding process.

 Delivered a 9-week hybrid NJfocused entrepreneurship training covering business management, financial planning, compliance, and risk mitigation.

 Offered interactive digital resources, live virtual classes, in-person workshops, expert 1:1 coaching, and networking opportunities to support long-term business success with a 100% graduation rate.



## **Licensing Update — Total Licenses Approved**

## Office of Compliance & Investigations

- Compliance Officers assigned to licensees and permittees (including testing labs)
  - Assist businesses in getting operational then monitor for continued compliance with the law and regulations
  - Conduct investigations into all complaints received 557 complaints reviewed and completed in 2024, currently 129 received and under investigation for 2025
- Investigators assigned for background investigations
  - Review all owners, managers, and employees for qualification to work in the industry (criminal histories, financial histories)
  - Conduct investigations for all ownership changes, financial source agreements, and management services contracts



## Ownership Changes, Financial Source Agreements, and Management Services Contracts

- All ownership changes require Board approval at a public meeting
- Financial Source Agreements and Management Service Contracts have been delegated to staff for approval
- Before the transaction is finalized, approval must be received
  - If money is to change hands in advance of receipt of approval, contracts must contain a clause that monies will be returned if approval by the NJ-CRC is not granted



### **Label and Packaging Approvals**

- Handled through the Metrc Seed-to-Sale system by Compliance Unit
- All labels and packaging must comply with the regulations (N.J.A.C. 17:30-16.2/.3)
- Flower packaging is passed through the system without initial review due to set up in the Metrc system, but is monitored during periodic audits for compliance with the regulations



### **Secret Shopper**

- Consumer Advocacy Group Safe Leaf's "secret shopper" program
- Coordinated with a licensed cannabis testing lab in NJ to test previously tested flower by other labs
- NJ-CRC requested additional info from Safe Leaf to assist in the NJ-CRC investigation
- The NJ-CRC's currently undertaking its own investigation in coordination with the Department of Health's State lab looking into testing practices of testing laboratories



## Committee Reports





### **Social Equity Excise Fee**

- Imposed on the cultivation of recreational cannabis by every licensed cannabis cultivator in New Jersey
- Not imposed on medicinal cannabis cultivation
- Fee = \$2.50 per ounce of usable/unusable cannabis
- To be used for social equity investments



### The Commission's Role

- The Commission held virtual public hearings on: February 20, 25, and 26.
- No later than May 1 of each year, the Commission must submit the recommendations to the Governor and Legislature for based upon the amount of any revenues collected during the current fiscal year.
- The Commission does not have the authority to appropriate SEEF monies.



## Permitting/Licensing Committee Report Focus Groups Recap

- ✓ May 2024 The Committee hosted a statewide hearing to learn from licensees and applicants about ways to improve our current licensing/permitting processes.
- ✓ June 2024 This Committee provided an update to the Board and public.
- ✓ Fall of 2024 The Committee hosted three (3) focus groups
  - ❖ November 6<sup>th</sup> Social Equity Applicants
  - ❖ November 7<sup>th</sup>- Microbusiness Applicants and Licensees
  - ❖ November 22<sup>nd</sup> All operational and non-operational licensees




## Permitting/Licensing Committee Report Recommendation #1

Allow businesses to have cooperative purchasing agreements –

Microbusinesses highlighted the importance of being able to access discounted wholesale items. With wholesale prices being high, the ability to collaborate with other businesses to buy cannabis products in bulk would help reduce financial strain, particularly for many locally owned businesses.

#### **Recommendation:**

The Permitting/Licensing Committee recommends that the Commission issues guidance that allows businesses to have cooperative purchasing agreements (CPAs).





## Permitting/Licensing Committee Report Recommendation #2

#### Rescind provisional badging -

Individuals with past convictions who were issued provisional badges by the NJ-CRC are being terminated by their employers due to failure to meet background check requirements.

This leads to major life disruptions for the terminated employees and forces employers to scramble to either rearrange employee schedules or hire additional personnel.



#### **Recommendation:**


The Permitting/Licensing Committee recommends that the Commission removes provisional badging and rescind Resolution 2024-199 Authorization for the issuance of provisional ATC and cannabis businesses employee identification cards, as provisional badging is no longer needed.



### Permitting/Licensing Committee Report Recommendation #3

Early Access to Personal Use Cannabis Business Operational Checklist –

Some applicants expressed confusion around whether certain facility features were optional or required.





#### **Recommendation:**

The Permitting/Licensing Committee recommends that the Commission does not wait until the Final Inspection to share the *Personal Use Cannabis Business Operational Checklist*. The checklist should be shared with applicants during the early licensing stages and can be published on the NJ-CRC website.

### **Amendments to Agency Bylaws**

Proposed changes in the following sections of the Commission's bylaws:

- 1. Meetings of the Commission
- 2. Committees of the Commission



### **Meetings of the Commission**

### Section 4.04 Quorum

A total of three (3) Commissioners shall constitute a quorum for all meetings of the Commission.



### **Committees of the Commission**

The Commission shall have permanent, standing committees as set forth in **Section 5.02**. A standing committee shall not be subject to dissolution unless the Commission has adopted a resolution amending Section 5.02 to reflect the dissolution of the standing committee.

- 1. The Audit Committee
- 2. The Public Engagement and Education Committee
- 3. The Product Safety, Packaging, and Labeling Committee
- 4. The Permitting/Licensing Committee
- 5. The Underage Deterrence and Prevention Fund Committee



### **Standing Committees**

### Section 5.02

**The Audit Committee**, that will be responsible for the development and approval of the Commission's budget, and review and monitoring of (1) the Commission's financial statements and the adequacy of its financial controls, (2) the results of any audit, and (3) compliance with all legal, regulatory, and ethical requirements. The Audit Committee will also be responsible for, in coordination with the Executive Director, coordination, review, drafting, and approval of regular annual, biennial, and other statutorily required reports before submission for consideration by the Commission. The Audit Committee is also responsible for securing a study to be conducted by a public research university at the 3-year anniversary of the inaugural Commission public meeting to review the Commission's organization, activities and effectiveness.



### **Standing Committees**

### **Section 5.02 (Continued)**

The Underage Deterrence and Prevention Fund Committee, that will be responsible for making recommendations to the full Board of Commissioners on appropriations of monies deposited in the Underage Deterrence and Prevention Account and to fund private for-profit and non-profit organizations, and county and municipal programs and services that are designed to improve, and support youthful community activities to divert and prevent persons under 18 years of age from activities associated with the consumption of cannabis items.
