RESOLUTION 2026-02-12-15 **IMPOSITION OF SANCTIONS AGAINST MOLLITIAM NJ LLC**

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 24:6I-37(d)(2) and -39(d)(2), and the implementing regulations, the Commission is authorized to suspend a business's adult-use license for failure to comply with applicable laws or regulations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-20.5(a), if the Commission identifies a violation of the Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6I-31 et seq., (the "CREAMM Act") or the implementing Personal-Use Cannabis Rules (the "Personal-Use Regulations"), the Commission may take enforcement action or impose sanctions, which may include suspension, revocation, non-renewal, or denial of permit and referral to State or local law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 24:6I-36a., each application for an annual license to operate a cannabis establishment must be submitted to the Commission, and a separate license is required for each location at which a cannabis establishment seeks to operate.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-10.1(b), A cannabis cultivator shall produce cannabis only at the cannabis business premises authorized in the license, including any indoor or outdoor areas; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 24:6I-46b.(1), in relevant part, a cannabis license holder is authorized to hold only one Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-20.8(a), the Commission may order a summary suspension of a license for cause upon a finding that one or more violations pose an immediate threat to consumers or to the health, safety, or welfare of the public, including, but not limited to: 1. Failure to comply with or satisfy any provision of this chapter; 2. Failure to allow a monitoring visit by authorized representatives of the Commission; 3. Falsification of any material or information submitted to the Commission; 4. Diversion of cannabis, as determined by the Commission; or 5. Threatening or harming a consumer, personnel, or an employee or representative of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-20.8, the Commission shall provide written notice to the cannabis business, testing laboratory, or its representative of the nature of the findings

and violations and the proposed order of suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-20.8(b), except in the case of a life-threatening emergency, the written notice shall provide the business 72 hours to correct the violation(s) and notify the Commission, in writing, of any corrective actions taken and proof of such corrective actions; and

WHEREAS, if the violations have not been corrected within the 72-hour period, the license shall be deemed suspended, effectively immediately; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Commission's regulations, the Commission may rescind an order for suspension upon a finding the business has corrected the conditions that were the basis for the proposed suspension; and

WHEREAS, Mollitiam NJ LLC ("Mollitiam"), a cannabis cultivator and cannabis manufacturer, was conducting an outdoor grow in an unapproved and unlicensed location, and was transporting its cultivated flower from the unlicensed location to its licensed location for storage, processing, and packaging; and

WHEREAS, Mollitiam was also storing cannabis in an unsecure area, failing to follow employee badging processes, failing to appropriately restrict access to premises, failing to notify the Commission regarding modifications to the license, failing to securely transport cannabis items, failing to appropriately store and dispose of expired cannabis items, failing to use the inventory tracking system designated by the Commission, and failing to update its cannabis item inventories on a regular basis; and

WHEREAS, on February 10, 2026, a Notice of Violation was issued to Mollitiam for violations of N.J.S.A. 24:6I-22a.(2)(c), -36a., -46b.(1)(a), and N.J.A.C. 17:30-3.6(a), -6.8(e)(1), -8.1, -9.2(a)5, -9.12(b), -9.13, -9.14, -9.15, -10.1(b), -10.3(a), -10.4, -10.7, and -11.1 (INV 13 26); and

WHEREAS, in determining the penalty, the Commission considered the following:

1. The egregiousness of the violation, and the Commission's duty to ensure such violations do not go unchecked in the interest of public safety.
2. Mollitiam's decision to conduct its outdoor grow operations despite having full knowledge that the NJ-CRC had not approved such operations and that its cultivation license did not authorize said operations.
3. Mollitiam's efforts to disguise the flower cultivated at the unauthorized location by transporting the material to its licensed location for storage, processing, and packaging.
4. The immediate threat to public safety if Mollitiam was allowed to continue operations during the NJ-CRC's investigation.
5. The Commission's responsibility to hold itself and regulated entities accountable to ensure the integrity of the agency and the industry as a whole.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission that Mollitiam violated the enabling statute and regulations, and, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:30-20.8, the Commission has determined to impose a **SUMMARY SUSPENSION**

of the adult-use licenses held by Mollitiam listed below.

A Notice of Proposed Suspension shall be provided to the license in accordance with this Resolution and the Commission’s regulations. The Notice shall include a copy of the proposed Order of Suspension.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-20.8, the license holder may request an adjudicatory hearing pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq., and 52:14F-1 et seq., to contest the Commission’s imposition of the proposed suspension for any violation within 48 hours of receipt of the Notice of Proposed Suspension.
