

REQUESTING PERMISSION FOR EILEEN MOORE TO PERFORM THE DUTIES AND EXERCISE THE POWERS OF A MEMBER OF THE CAPITAL COMMITTEE FOR CAESARS ENTERTAINMENT CORPORATION PENDING PLENARY QUALIFICATION (PRN 3561101)

WHEREAS, this matter having been brought before the New Jersey Casino Control Commission (Commission) by the Petition of Caesars Entertainment Corporation (CEC) and Caesars Entertainment Operating Company, Inc. WHEREAS, the Division does not object to the Commission granting the requested relief prior to the expiration of the period specified in *N.J.A.C.* 13:69C-2.7(c)2;

WHEREAS, the Commission considered the entire record of the proceedings at its public meeting of January 18, 2012; and
