11	<p>1 ITEM NO.12</p> <p>2 Most people who gamble do so as a form</p> <p>3 of entertainment socially, and with no</p> <p>4 problems. However, some people develop</p> <p>5 problems with gambling or at risk of</p> <p>6 addictions. Young people too can be at serious</p> <p>7 risk.</p> <p>8 The month-long observance offers an</p> <p>9 opportunity for organizations such as the</p> <p>10 Council on Compulsive Gambling in New Jersey,</p> <p>11 led by Executive Director Luis Del Orbe to</p> <p>12 educate the general public and healthcare</p> <p>13 professionals about the warning signs of</p> <p>14 problem gambling.</p> <p>15 The Council promotes awareness of</p> <p>16 critical information, resources, and support</p> <p>17 available year-round. There are 9 nine casinos in Atlantic City, including Hard 10 Rock Hotel & Casino where I serve as President 11 as well. 12 The Atlantic City casino industry is one 13 of the largest employers in South Jersey, 14 supporting tens of thousands of jobs and 15 generating hundreds of millions of dollars in 16 tax revenue. Nationally its "Caring Communities,</p> <p>9 Stronger Future." Two themes that reflect the</p> <p>10 shared responsibility of regulators, operators,</p> <p>11 treatment providers, and advocates.</p> <p>12 New Jersey's gaming market continues to</p> <p>13 grow. Internet gaming and sports wagering</p> <p>14 generate a significant revenue each year. DGE is</p> <p>9 providing access to GamFin, a financial</p> <p>10 wellness service designed to support</p> <p>11 individuals impacted by gaming.
