Overview:

The National Center for Disaster Preparedness Superstorm Sandy Child and Family Health (S-CAFH) Study is a three to five year longitudinal study that would examine Sandy-related health effects, recovery trajectories, evacuation and recovery decision-making and efficacy of formal help mechanisms, etc. in New Jersey and New York. The New Jersey portion of the proposed study would survey 1,000 households from NJ. The baseline assessment would allow for data to be collected, analyzed, and disseminated quickly with a broader and more detailed understanding of recovery occurring during the longitudinal phase. The cost of the New Jersey portion is \$1.19 million for the entire study.
