<b>Overview:</b>
The Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) provides grants to states and local governments to implement long-term hazard mitigation measures after a major disaster declaration. The purpose of the HMGP is to reduce the loss of life and property due to natural disasters and to enable mitigation measures to be implemented during the immediate recovery from a disaster. The HMGP is authorized under Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act.
<b>Federal Department of Origin:</b>
Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)
<b>Federal Requirements / Restrictions:</b>
Applicants for HMGP funding must have a FEMA-approved State Mitigation Plan at the time of the disaster declaration and at the time HMGP funding is obligated to the Grantee in order to receive an HMGP award. States without an approved plan at the time of the declaration have 30 calendar days from the date of the declaration to formally submit an approvable State (Standard or Enhanced) Mitigation Plan for FEMA review and approval.

<b>Other Notes:</b>
44 CFR Part 206, Emergency Management and Assistance prescribes policies and procedures for implementing the sections of Public Law 93288 (the Stafford Act) that are delegated to the director of FEMA, including the administration of HMGP. Superstorm Sandy's hazard mitigation grant program is referred to as DR 4086 HMGP.
