Procurement Process:

The current contract with Community Health Law Project will be modified. The contract term of the current contract ends on 6/30/2014

This includes contract modification, revised scope of services and program requirement changes, detailed budgets, contract monitoring and oversight to ensure compliance with all pertinent contract requirements including additional Sandy oversight activities, at a minimum, quarterly expenditure reporting as the frequency may be enhanced for Sandy services, fiscal monitoring and oversight of the expenditure reporting, coordination with program oversight staff and onsite field visits as deemed applicable.

Eligibility Standards:

The individual must be a citizen of the United States or have permanent residency. This will be evidenced by an original or certified birth certificate, passport, consular registration of birth abroad certificate, certificate of citizenship, or a certificate of naturalization or green card. Residency will be evidenced by presenting a NJ driver's license, passport, shelter records, school records showing address, utility records, credit card bill, checking or savings account statement showing address, original lease or rental agreement, property tax bill, statement or record from the past year, any letter or correspondence received from the IRS or state tax office, first class mail received from any federal state or local government agency in the past year or provider agency service documentation.

If affected by superstorm Sandy and in need of legal services on a related matter.

Implementation/Timeline:

As soon as the contract expansion is approved, press releases announcing the services will be executed. How to and the process for application will be announced through our extensive provider and community based network.
