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Bayside State Prison Visit Procedures and Schedule

1. When arriving at the Medium facility for AM visits you can enter the front house at 0630 to get a visit registration form, you can reenter for the registration period at 0745. For Afternoon visits you can enter the front house to get a visit registration form at 0930, you can reenter for the registration period at 1145.

When arriving at the Farm for either AM or PM visits, you may either wait in your vehicle or by the yellow gate and you will be called up for registration.

2. A maximum of 4 adults are permitted to visit, with no more children than the adult visitors can handle. **If you are bringing a minor you must have the minor's Birth Certificate. In addition, if you are not the parent or legal guardian you will also need a Notarized letter from the parent or legal guardian.** If you are the appointed legal guardian you must bring court documentation stating your appointment. An adult visitor must accompany and supervise the children they brought at all times. Children are not permitted to run/ rough house in the Front house or the Visit Hall. Adult visitors with children that cannot be made to comply with the rules of the Visit Hall will be required to depart. This rule ensures that ALL visitors are afforded an equal opportunity to visit in a pleasant environment.
3. Visitors must present a valid photo identification with birthdate. Acceptable forms of photo identification include:
 - a. A current photo driver's license
 - b. A current photo Welfare/Medicaid card (**must have Birth date on ID**)
 - c. An employment photo ID (**must have Birth date on ID**)
 - d. A current passport
4. No inappropriate contact will be permitted in the visit hall. A brief **CLOSED MOUTH** kiss and hug are permitted at the beginning and the end of the visit **ONLY**. Anyone who does not abide by the correctional facilities rules on this will be temporarily banned in accordance with the institutional policies.
5. **No Gum or Candy is permitted in the visit hall.** Anyone who does not abide by the correctional facilities rules on this or any other NJDOC procedure will be temporarily banned in accordance with the institutional policies.
6. In accordance with NJAC 10A:18 6.14, all visitors, their belongings, and their vehicles are subject to searches while on the premises.

9. Non-Contact Visits for Zero Tolerance – To schedule this visit, you must call 856-785-0040 ext. 5416. All non-contact visits are held on Wednesdays in which visitors will get a **one hour** window visit between the hours of 0900-1200. Visitors that are scheduled for a non-contact visit must adhere to the same dress code as contact visits.

Visitor Dress Code

Proper attire is regarded as a condition of admission to a New Jersey Department of Corrections facility.

Prohibited Items

The following items are not authorized to enter the Visit Program visiting areas:

- Cell phones, beepers or other electronic devices.
- Credit cards, bank access cards, etc.
- Condoms, cosmetics, candy and cigarettes.
- Drugs (prescribed or otherwise) (Asthma inhalers and other life sustaining medications must be clearly marked and surrendered to the Visit Supervisor prior to entering the visit area.
- Keys (with the exceptions of locker keys and/or one vehicle key – no remotes or alarms).
- Money (cash or coin).
- Photographs.
- Purses, handbags and wallets (Clear plastic clutch bags or clear zip-lock sandwich bags may be utilized for authorized items).
- Sunglasses (non-prescription).
- Transportation passes.
- Weapons or sharp objects.
- Any item deemed to be a threat to the orderly running of the institution.

Prohibited Garments

The following guidelines must be followed, regardless of gender:

- No transparent or fishnet clothing.
- No clothing that exposes undergarments or a portion of the body considered private.
- No skin-tight clothing.
- Tops must cover shoulders and midriff areas. No tube tops, tank tops, halter tops, low-cut shirts or shirts that expose shoulder, midriff area, torso or back.
- Bottoms must at least cover waist to mid-thigh. No shorts, skirts or dresses ending above mid-thigh, or which have an inseam length or slit ending more than three inches above the knee. No low-rise shorts, skirts or pants that expose the midriff or any portion of the buttocks.
- No otherwise clearly inappropriate attire, as determined solely by New Jersey Department of Corrections staff on duty. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Military-style clothing worn by persons not in active or reserve military status
 - clothing closely resembling that issued to inmates
 - custody staff or law enforcement
 - professional-styled uniforms such as but not limited to:
 - medical/nursing
 - postal workers
 - delivery service, etc
- Clothing depicting a message, either in wording or art, that could impact upon the safety, security or orderly operation of the correctional facility, including, but not limited to, that which is offensive, racist, sexually oriented, or advocates illegal or narcotic activities
- No hat or headgear, unless it is religiously oriented or medically necessary, and the visitor agrees to a search of same
- No shoes or sneakers with wheels (i.e.: Heelys).
- No flip-flops
- No steel-toed boots

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
