A regular meeting of the Civil Service Commission was held on Wednesday, April 9, 2014, in Trenton, New Jersey.

The Division of Classification and Personnel Management requests the reactivation of the title Maintenance Repairer/ Radio Dispatcher which was inactivated in December 2011, due to non-use.

The title was created in May 2011 as the result of a classification determination, and was made effective retroactive to January 15, 2011. The AA was unable to utilize the title when it became available as the Council of the City of Vineland did not pass a necessary ordinance approving its use. At this time, the Council of the City of Vineland has adopted said ordinance and the AA wishes to make a retroactive appointment into this title.

Following the Commission's approval of this action, the AA requests reactivation retroactive to January 15, 2011, the date the title was originally created, for the appointment of the incumbent performing this function.



B-3 CHANGE IN CLASSIFICATION PLAN – TITLE INACTIVATION AND REACTIVATION

The Division of Classification and Personnel Management requests inactivation of the local title Claims Examiner Workers Compensation Typing in exchange for reactivating the base title, Claims Examiner Workers Compensation.



Local Government Titles

The Division of Classification and Personal Management requests the inactivation of the title Claims Examiner Workers Compensation Typing (01242), in exchange for the reactivation of the primary title Claims Examiner Workers Compensation (01241), inactivated in 1987.

We have received a request from an AA to remove the typing language from the typing variant. We have proposed instead exchanging the typing variant for the inactive primary title. A review of the specification indicates that the primary function of the title is the processing of accident reports, rather than typing. Inactivating the typing variant is consistent with the CSC's current position that use of a keyboard is essentially universally expected, eliminating the need for specialized typing titles.

The title actions will be processed as lateral employee movements, appointment type to appointment type, with retention of existing status.

Upon successful completion of this process, any existing eligibility lists for these titles shall be processed as follows:

- Promotional and open competitive lists issued from pending announcements for any affected title
 in which employees with provisional appointments are serving will be certified for one time use
 only in order to effect permanent appointment (s), and will be declared expired upon disposition
 of the certification.
- A complete list that has never been used and contains no employees with current provisional appointments for the title and unit scope specified shall be declared expired.
- A complete list which contains employees with current provisional appointments for the title and unit scope specified (with the exception of such employees currently on active military duty) will be processed for one time use and will be declared expired upon the disposition of certification.
- An incomplete list containing no employee with current provisional appointments for the title and unit scope specified shall be declared expired.

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- Any employee currently on active military duty will be afforded all applicable rights under Federal and State law upon their release from active duty and given the opportunity to apply and compete for any announcements for which they would otherwise have been eligible but for their military service.
- Eligibility lists for affected titles and unit scopes which have expired will be revived as necessary to address unanticipated situations which may arise.

We have notified jurisdictions using these titles of our plans and provided them with the opportunity to review and comment. No objections to this plan were received.

The effective date of this title reactivation will be the first pay period that follows the Commission's approval of the action.

B-5 EUGENE B. TURONIS

Eugene B. Turonis, represented by Alex Klein, Esq., appeals his rejection as a Fire Fighter candidate by Hoboken and its request to remove his name from the eligible list for Fire Fighter (M2537M) on the basis of psychological unfitness to perform effectively the duties of the position.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be granted.

B-6 QUEEN WILLIAMS AND WINSOME SAMUELS

B-39 DONDRU PHILLIPS

Dondru Phillips appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services which found that, per the substitution clause for education, she did not meet the experience requirements for the promotional examination for Personnel Assistant 4 (PS8518R), Board of Public Utilities.

B-40 AL'JAWANN REED, JR.

Al'Jawann Reed, Jr., represented by Rene Demuynck, Chief Shop Steward, CWA Local 1037 appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services which found that he did not meet the experience requirements for the open competitive examination for Principal Stock Clerk (S0550R), Statewide.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-41 JESSICA REID

Jessica Reid appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services that she did not meet the education requirement for the open competitive examination for Animal Health Technician, (C0631R), Essex County.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be granted.

B-42 WILLIAM RICCI

William Ricci appeals his score for the oral portion of the examination for the second level Fire Captain (PM0056R), Clifton.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-43 FREDERIC SCHATZMANN, III

Frederic Schatzmann, III appeals his score for the oral portion of the examination for the second level Fire Captain (PM0178R), New Brunswick.

B-44 EDWARD TAYLOR

Edward Taylor appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services that he did not meet the experience requirements for the open competitive examination for Customer Service Information Specialist 3, Tourism Welcome Center (S0226R), Statewide.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be granted.

B-45 WILLIAM TUNNEY

William Tunney appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services that he did not meet the education and experience requirements for the open competitive examination for Marine Mechanic (S0727R), Statewide.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be granted.

B-46 THOMAS WOLANSKY

Thomas Wolansky appeals his score for the oral portion of the examination for the second level Fire Captain (PM0076R), Union Township.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-47 ZHENHUA ZHANG

Zhenhua Zang appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services that he did not meet the experience requirement for the promotional examination for Network Administrator 1 (PS0581K), Department of Children and Families.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be granted.

B-48 CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION MINUTES

Submitted for adoption are the Civil Service Commission minutes of its meeting of March 26, 2014.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission adopted the minutes of its meeting of March 26, 2014.

B-49 RONALD LEMONGELLO

Ronald Lemongello appeals his rejection as a Correction Officer Recruit candidate by the Department of Corrections and its request to remove his name from the eligible list for Correction Officer Recruit (S9987M) on the basis of psychological unfitness to perform effectively the duties of the position.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-50 DAVID ANTHONY

David Anthony, a Management Specialist with Hudson County, represented by David B. Beckett, Esq., petitions the Civil Service Commission for interim relief of his termination.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this petition be denied.

B-51 TAMIKA VEAL-JOHNSON

Tamika Veal-Johnson, represented by Jack A. Butler, Esq., appeals the decision of the City of Trenton to remove her name from the Police Officer, City of Trenton special reemployment eligible list due to an unsatisfactory criminal record.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-52 VICTOR WASHINGTON

Victor Washington appeals the decision of the Division of Classification and Personnel Management which found that the Department of Corrections had presented a sufficient basis to remove his name from the Correction Officer Recruit (S9987K), eligible list due to an unsatisfactory criminal record.

B-53 JESSEY KARTO

Jessey Karto requests a review of the scoring, and requests a retest, of the promotional examination for Cottage Training Technician (PS8361K), New Lisbon Developmental Center.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-54 DIAHANN COLLINS-BLOOR

Diahann Collins-Bloor appeals the determination of the Division of Classification and Personnel Management that her position with the Department of Health is properly classified as a Technical Assistant 3. The appellant seeks a Technical Assistant, Contract Administration job classification.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-55 SHARON FENSTERMACHER

Sharon Fenstermacher appeals the decision of the Division of Classification and Personnel Management which found that her position with the Department of the Treasury is properly classified as Auditor 3. The appellant seeks an Auditor 2 job classification.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this appeal be denied.

B-56 A.C.

A.C., a Family Service Specialist 2 with the Department of Children and Families appeals the determination of DCF's Director of Administration and Legal Affairs stating that the appellant failed to present sufficient evidence to support a finding that she had been subjected to violations of the New Jersey State Policy Prohibiting Discrimination in the Workplace (State Policy).

B-57 NITA SHAH

Nita Shah petitions the Civil Service Commission for reconsideration of the final administrative decision rendered on November 20, 2013, in which the Commission denied the appellant's examination appeal.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission directed that this petition be denied.

B-58 ROBERT RIVERA

The appeal of Robert Rivera, a Housing Assistant Technician, Bilingual in Spanish and English, with Passaic County, of his removal effective December 29, 2010, on charges, was heard by Administrative Law Judge Sandra Ann Robinson (ALJ), who rendered her initial decision on January 23, 2014 in which she modified the removal to a 90 working day suspension. At its meeting on March 26, 2014, the Civil Service Commission modified the removal to a 120 working day suspension. The proposed decision is now submitted for the Commission's review.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission adopted the decision.

B-59 TYWANA L. SMITH AND DUEWA EDWARDS-DICKSON

The appeals of Tywana L. Smith, a former Deputy Director, Human Services and DuEwa Edwards-Dickson, a former Program Coordinator, Aging, of their layoffs from the City of Trenton, effective November 5, 2010, were heard by Administrative Law Judge Ronald W. Reba (ALJ), who rendered his initial decision on February 10, 2014. At its meeting on March 26, 2014, the Civil Service Commission accepted the ALJ's recommendation to deny the appellants' appeals. However, it did not agree with the ALJ's determination that Smith did not have the standing to appeal her layoff because she was serving provisionally in the title of Deputy Director, Human Services. The proposed final decision is now submitted for the Commission's review.

ACTION: The Civil Service Commission adopted the final decision.
