Richard Calo, a Sheriff's Officer with the Essex County Sheriff's Office, petitions the Civil Service Commission for an Intergovernmental Transfer to the title of County Police Officer, Bergen County.

B-68 RHONDA DENSON-JOHNSON

The appeal of Rhonda Denson-Johnson, a County Correction Officer with Atlantic County, of her six working day suspension, on charges, was heard by Administrative Law Judge Damon G. Tyner (ALJ), who rendered his initial decision on June 7, 2013. At its meeting on July 17, 2013, the Civil Service Commission adopted the ALJ's recommendation to grant the appointing authority's cross motion for summary decision and uphold the six working day suspension. However, the Commission found it necessary to address the exceptions filed on behalf of the appellant. The proposed final decision is now submitted for the Commission's review.
