Host Inaugural Law Enforcement Hiring Expo

TRENTON - The New Jersey Civil Service Commission (CSC) successfully hosted its first-ever law enforcement hiring expo, "*Experience the Badge: Join the Force*," on Saturday, May 17, 2025. This groundbreaking event, held in collaboration with the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office, attracted approximately 400 participants eager to explore career opportunities within New Jersey's law enforcement sector.

Designed to provide an immersive experience, the expo catered to individuals interested in learning about various aspects of a career in law enforcement. Whether attendees were curious about the application process, exploring diverse career paths within the field, or seeking insight into the physical fitness requirements, the event offered comprehensive resources and guidance.

The day's events offered engaging activities, including unit demonstrations from the Aerial Drone Unit, K-9 Unit, and Motorcycle Unit. Attendees were also treated to a tour of the Technical Command and Communications Center, a Police Training Commission fitness demonstration, and an on-site job fair. The job fair provided participants with the opportunity to speak directly with State and local hiring authorities about current job openings and potential future employment.
