

Lead Remediation and Abatement Program (LRAP)

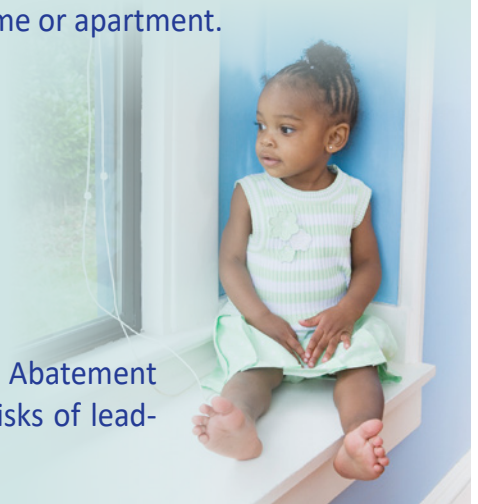
Don't wait to remove lead paint

There are dangers to having lead-based paint in buildings. Lead is toxic, especially to children and can potentially cause permanent health issues. The most common way young children are exposed to lead is by putting lead-based paint chips in their mouth or by inhaling dust in and around their home or apartment.

Untreated, lead-based paint may lead to complications such as:

- Irreversible brain damage
- Kidney/liver damage
- Infertility
- Nervous system damage
- Seizures

If your home was built before 1978, New Jersey's Lead Remediation and Abatement Program (LRAP) may be able to help. LRAP addresses the serious health risks of lead-based paint by removing lead-based paint hazards from homes.

Program Requirements

- Property was built prior to 1978.
- Property has lead-based paint hazards.
- Property contains no more than 10 residential units.
- Property is free from structural issues.
- Vacant units are eligible.

Eligibility

- Occupant must have a gross household income that does not exceed 80% of median income.
- The program is open to tenants and landlords (occupant must be income eligible)
