This includes updating the totals reported, a new 3-year OOH trend report, and a monthly OOH report grouped by similar treatment settings.










CWS Referrals Assigned to Local Offices








Completed Independent Living Assessments of Youth Ages 14-18 years



IAIU Caseload Report Statewide



IAIU Caseload Report by Region












Rate of Children in Care Management by Service Area as of January 31st 2025 n=17,351








