As of October 2022, the CSOC OOH sections will now include all CSOC Out of Home Treatment Settings (Behavioral Health, Intellectual/Developmentally Disabled, and Substance Use). This includes updating the totals reported, a new 3-year OOH trend report, and a monthly OOH report grouped by similar treatment settings.



Any of these youth may be receiving services. These definitions are currently being reviewed to better understand how we capture DCF's work with this population. The goal of this ongoing work is to create three meaningful categories for 18-21 year olds 1) Youth in a formal out-of-home placement setting, 2) Youth that achieved permanency.

Completed Independent Living Assessments of Youth Ages 14-18 years






IAIU Caseload Report Statewide




IAIU Caseload Report by Region











Rate of Children in Care Management by Service Area as of February 28th 2025 n=17,433
















- Of fices with blank data do not carry adoption case loads , however adoption cases in those of fices are handled by other of fices in that area.
