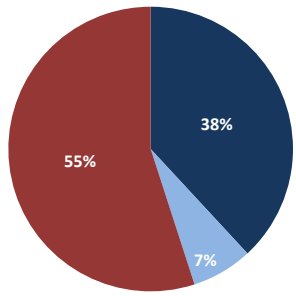

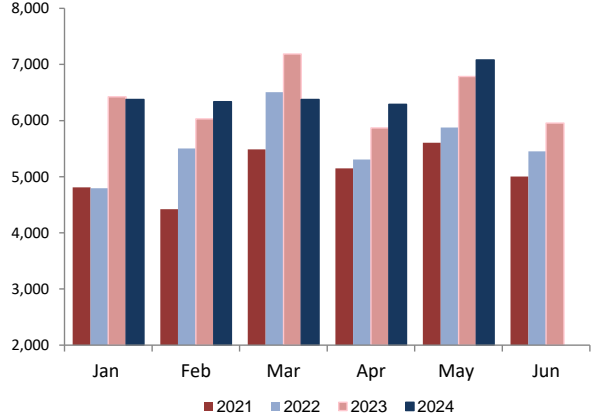

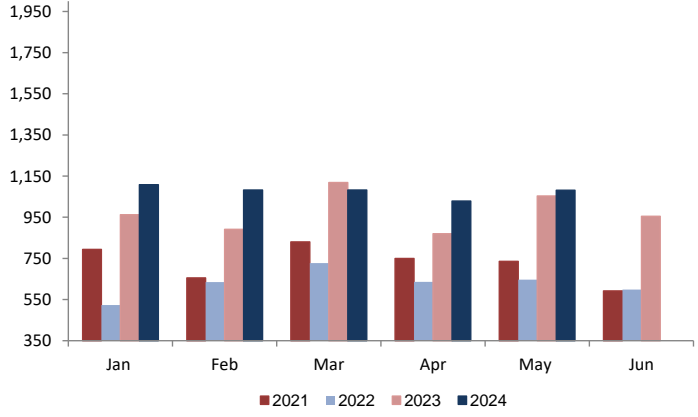

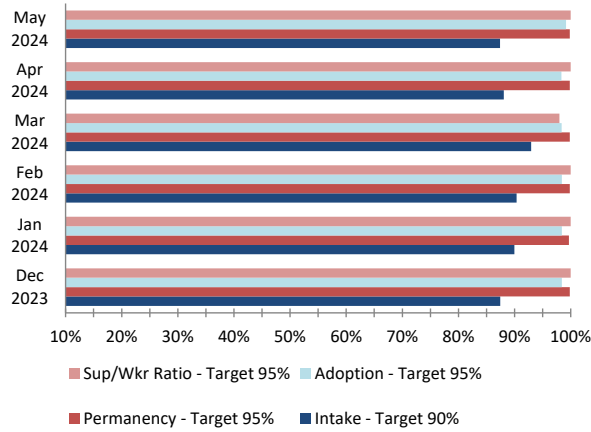


### CWS Referrals Assigned to Local Offices

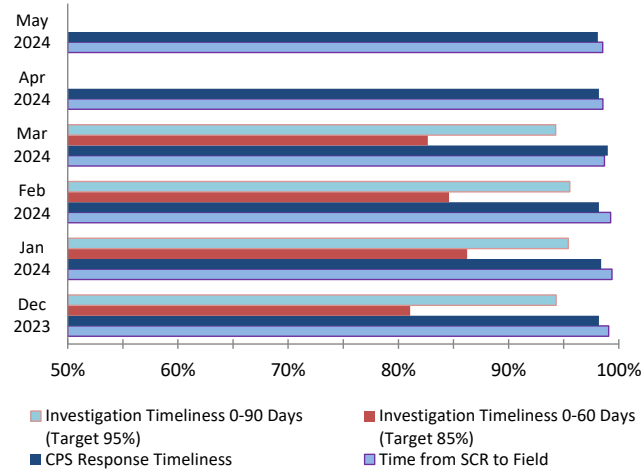

### Caseload Compliance (Individual Worker Level)

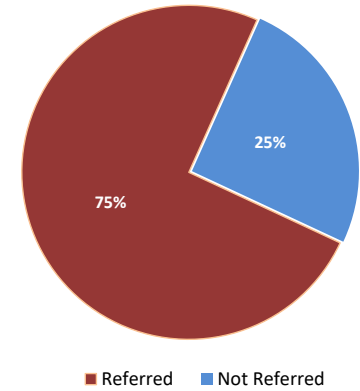


### Response and Investigation Timeliness

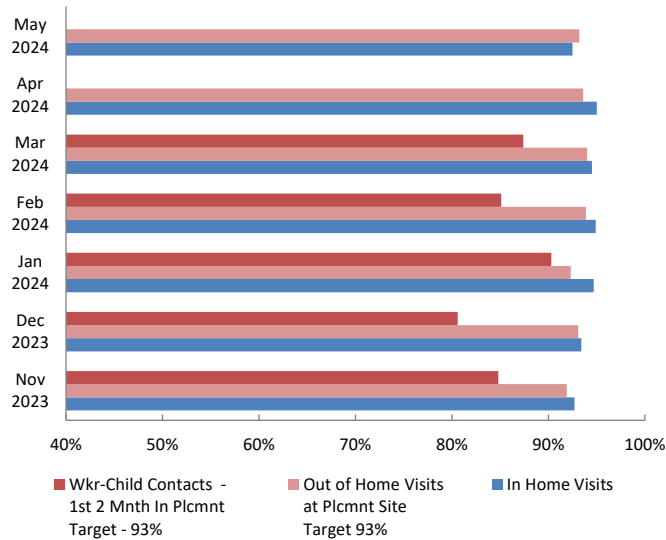


### Referrals to Early Intervention

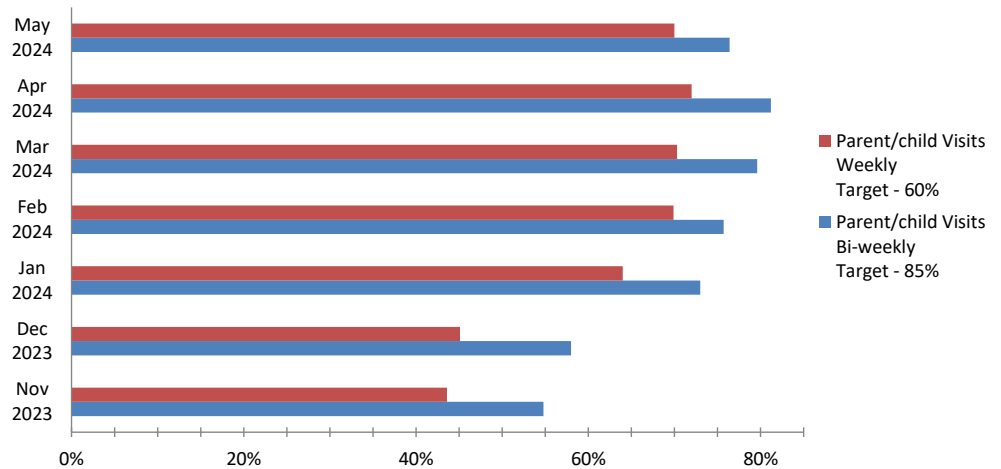

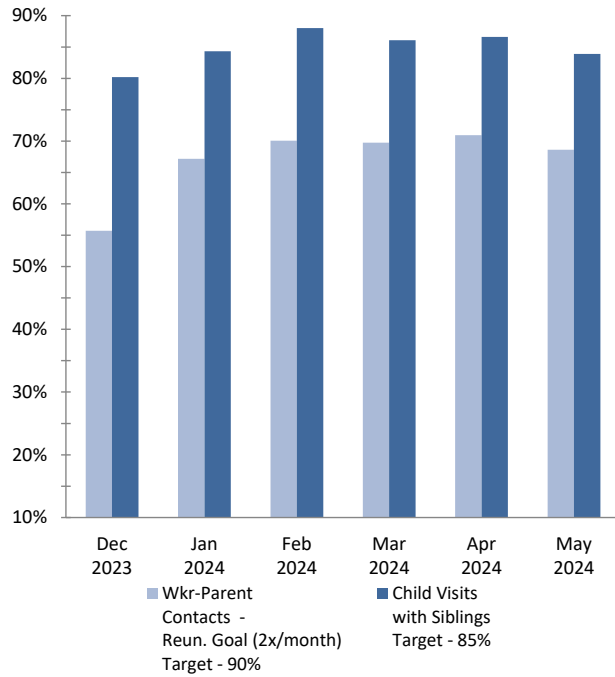

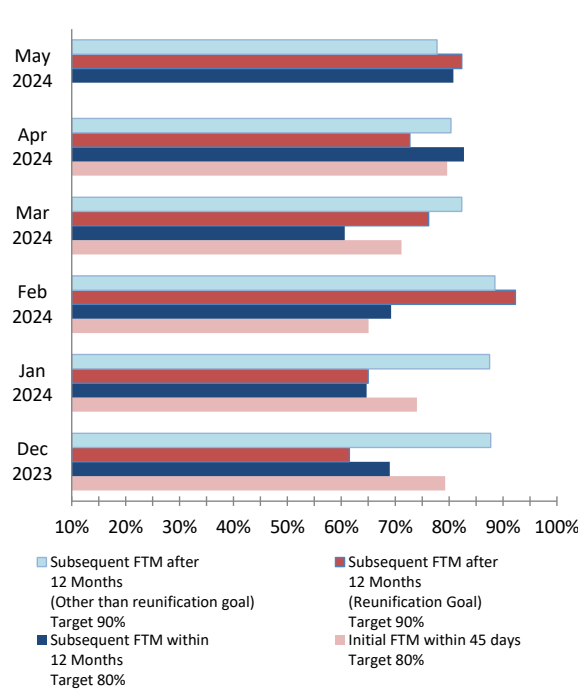

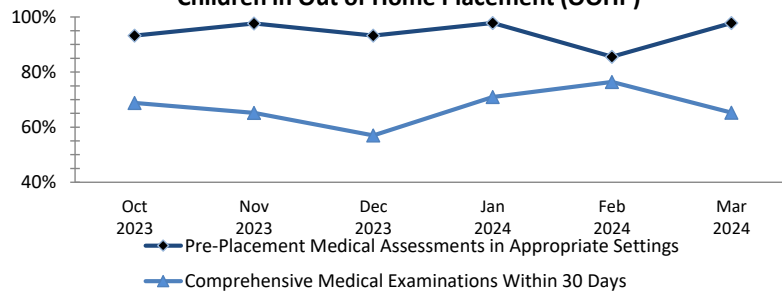

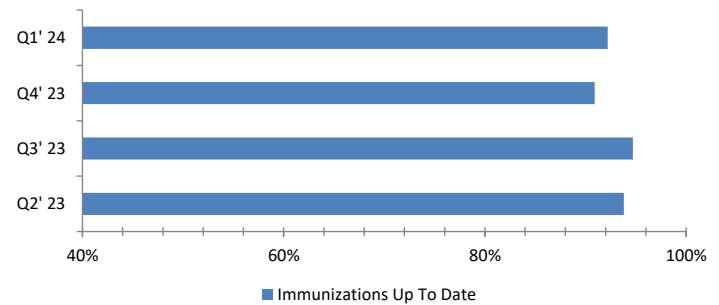

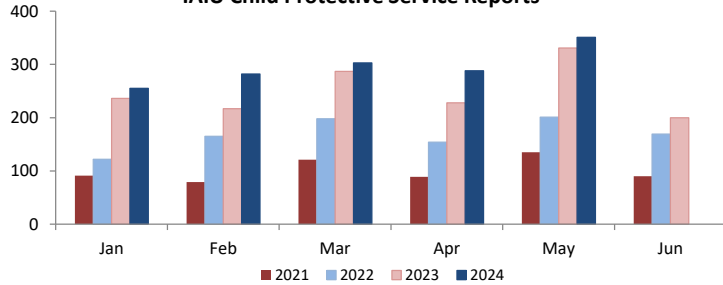

The goal of this ongoing work is to create three meaningful categories for 18-21 year olds: 1) Youth in a formal out-of-home placement setting, 2) Youth that achieved permanency, and 3) Youth that never achieved permanency.

of Youth Ages 14-18 years

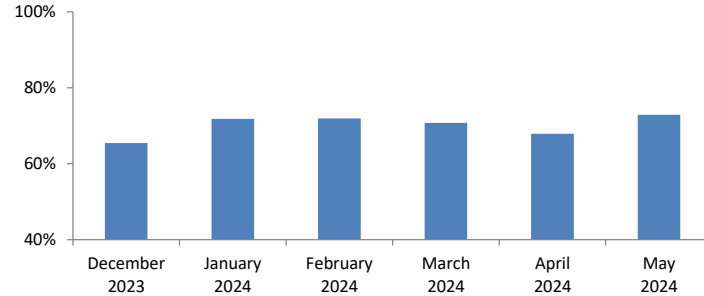

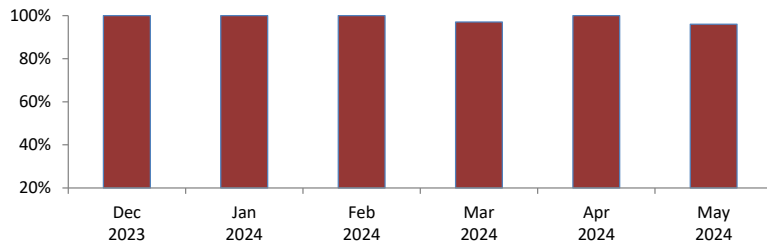


IAIU Investigation Timeliness

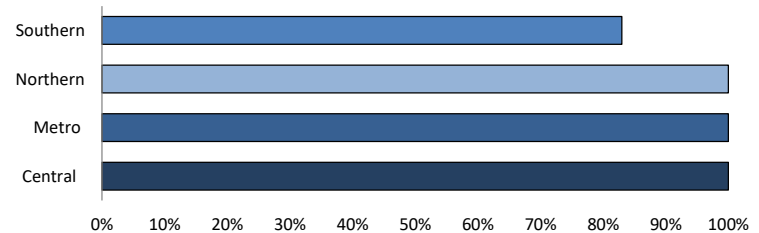


IAIU Caseload Report

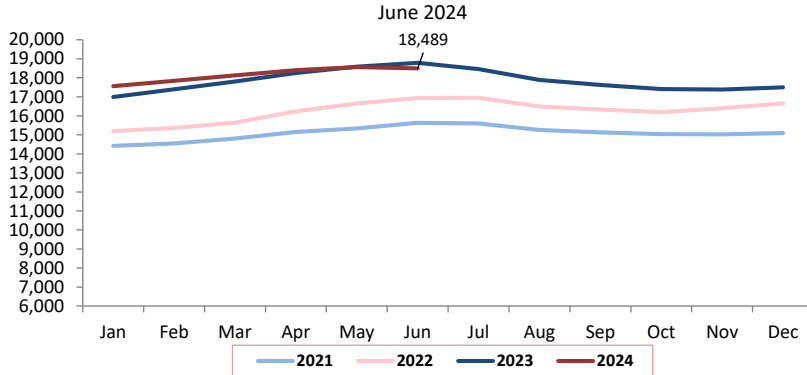
IAIU Caseload Report by Region  
May 2024



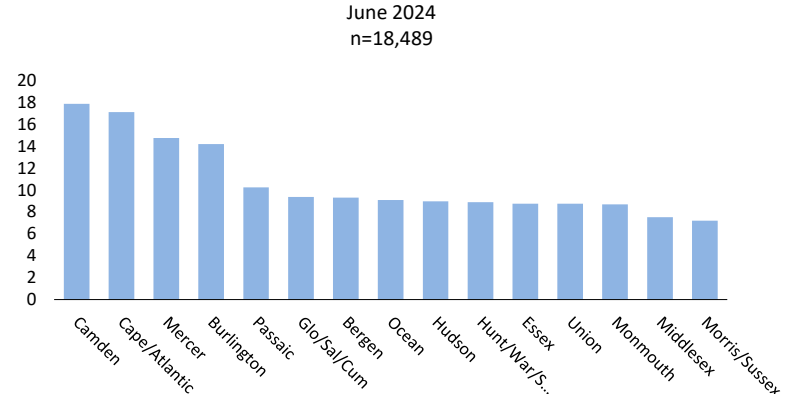

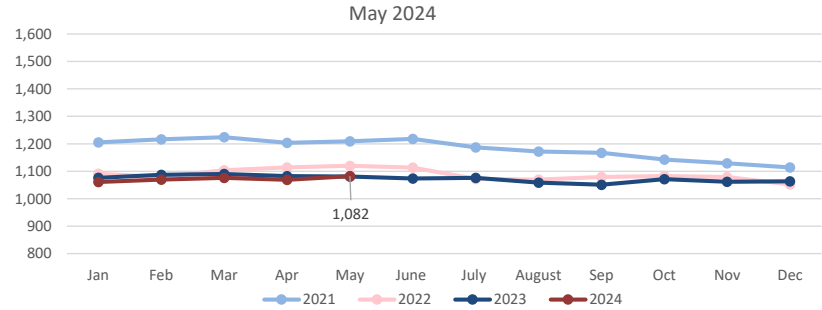
**Children in Care Management**



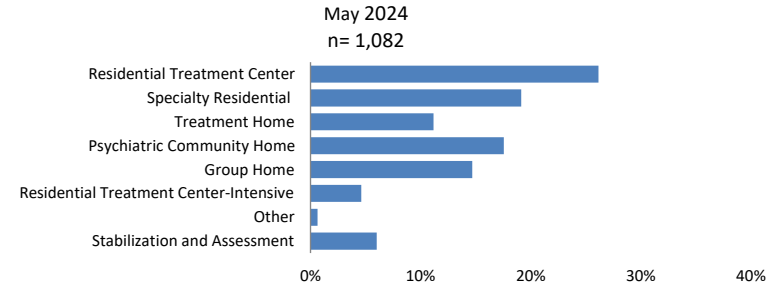
**Rate of Children in Care Management by Service Area**



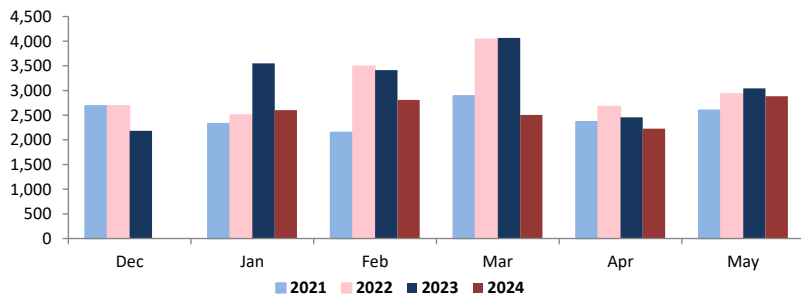
**Children in Out of Home Treatment Settings**



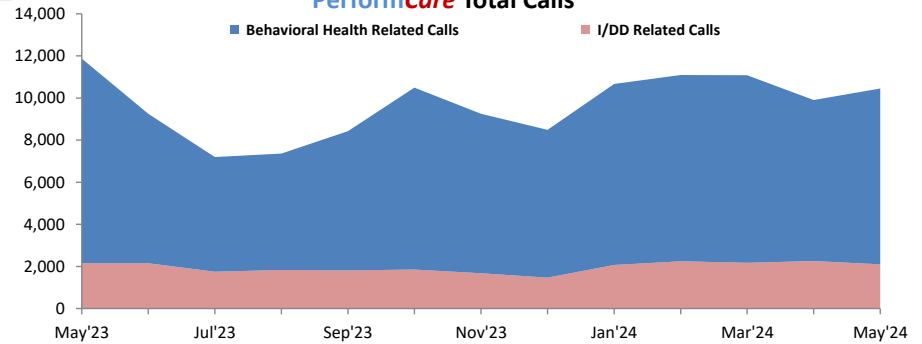
**Children in Out-of-Home Treatment Settings**



**Mobile Response Stabilization Services (MRSS) Dispatched**

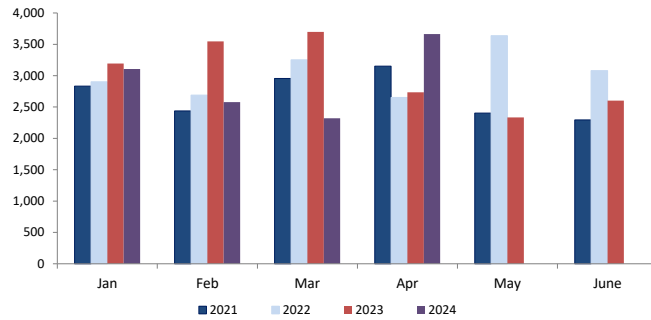

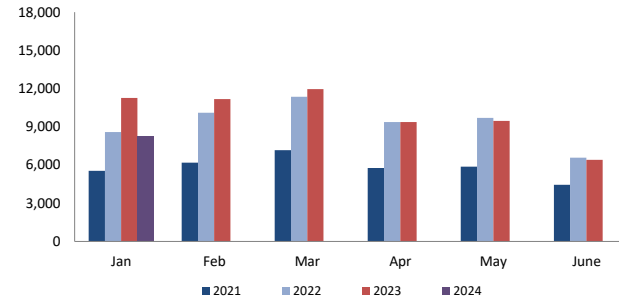

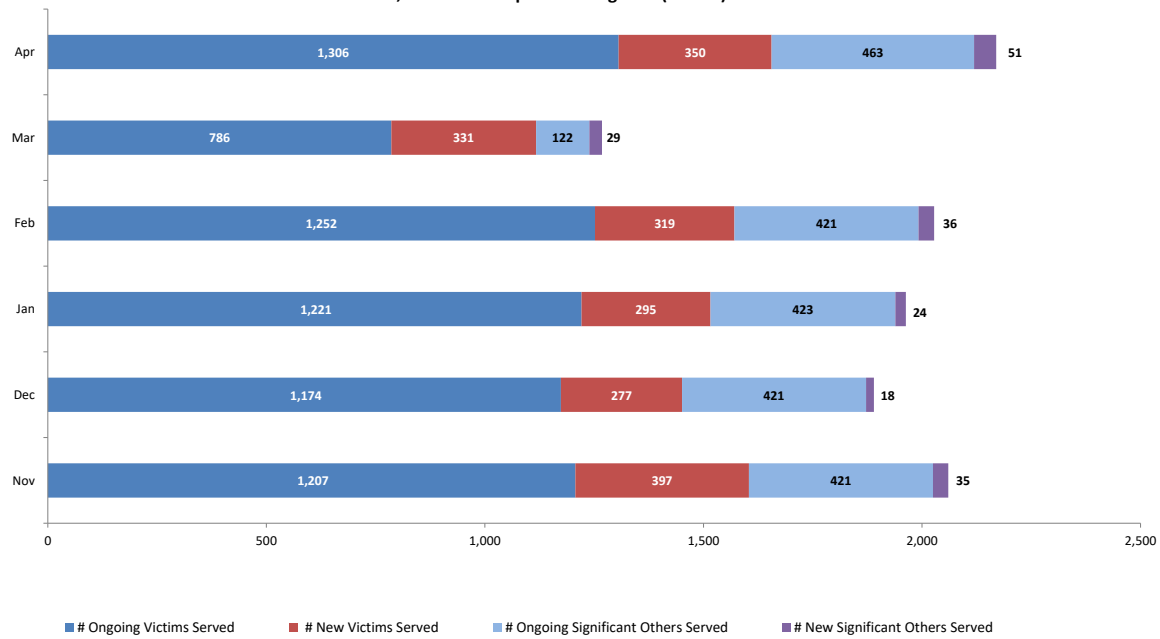


**School-Based Youth Services Programs - New and Ongoing Clients Served**



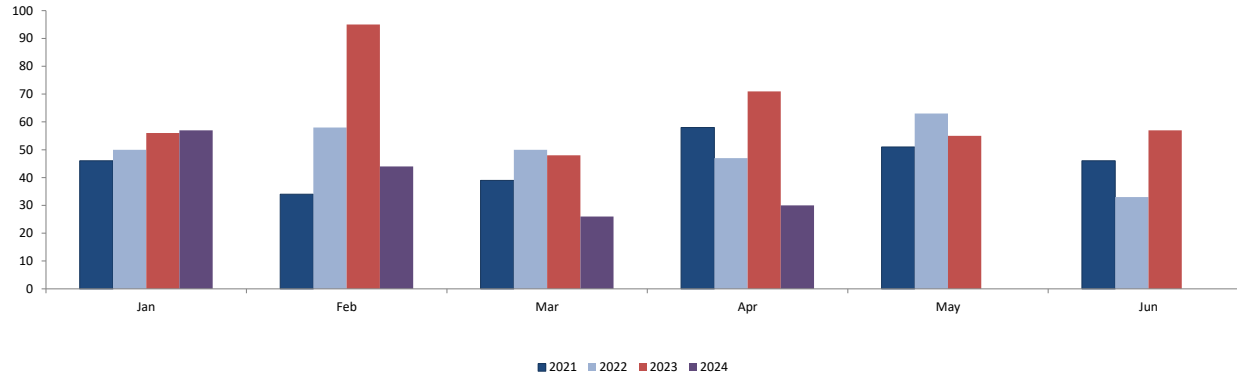

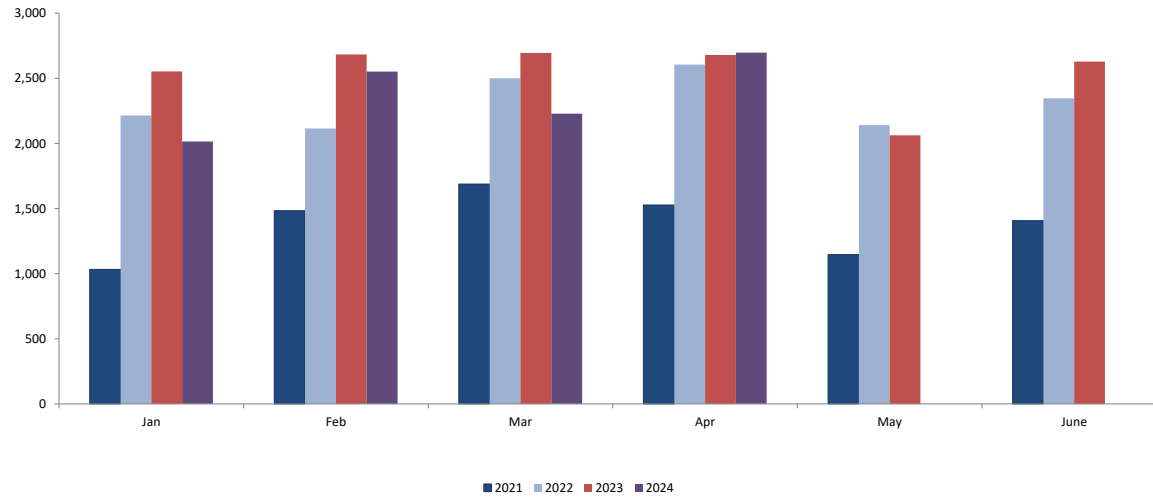
