3. Mission/Goals of Agency

The New Jersey Department of Children and Families (DCF or the Department) is the state's Cabinet-level agency devoted exclusively to serving and supporting children and families. In collaboration with state and local government agencies, and in partnership with New Jersey's non-governmental organizations and community members, DCF administers programs and services that help residents be or become safe, healthy, and connected. DCF focuses its work and resources on strengthening communities, empowering families, and protecting women and children by promoting and utilizing best practice and evidence-based standards to achieve positive outcomes. Current priorities include the prevention of maltreatment and maltreatment related fatalities, preserving kinship connections, facilitating the health and wellness of staff, and ensuring the quality and effectiveness of contracted services.

With a staff of over 6,600 employees, DCF delivers direct services through the Divisions of: Child Protection and Permanency; Children's System of Care; Family and Community Partnerships; Women; and the Office of Education.

4. **Description of Financial Operations Systems** +

DCF will serve as the state conduit agency for the SSBG grant allocated to the State of New Jersey. DCF has multiple offices that work to ensure the Department is a good steward of state and federal dollars and manages financially responsible grant programs and contracting. Within DCF's fiscal department, the Budget Office manages the fiscal aspects of federal grants, including SSBG. Based on the Notice of Award, the Budget Office establishes the total amount of the award and allocates the amount to the respective account in the New Jersey state accounting system, New Jersey Comprehensive Financial System (NJCFS). NJCFS is utilized to set up accounts, encumbrances, cash receipts, and payment disbursements. All transactions made in NJCFS are automatically transferred to an automated Business Objects system that enables users to create reports, visualize data, manage analytics, and utilize data tools, e.g., Web Intelligence. Within the Budget Office, an analyst is assigned to manage the fiscal aspects of each grant. These systems safeguard against expenditures from exceeding the allocated budgeted amount for the account.

III. Program Planning

1. Planning for Distribution and Use of Funds

Describe the planning process for determining the State's use and distribution of SSBG funds.

DCF has served as the lead agency for SSBG since SFY 2016, when the state streamlined the administration of this grant and realigned the responsibility for these funds from the New Jersey Department of Human Services (DHS) to DCF. In SFY 2027, DCF will again manage the grant administration for SSBG. The planning process for the use and distribution of SSBG funds is coordinated by DCF's Budget Office, in partnership with Department leadership. As was done in recent years, DCF spending categories for SFY 27, as represented in the SFY 2027 Pre-Expenditure report, include:

1. Case Management – funds utilized to support the child protection and welfare agency's local office case management program, including caseworker salaries and non-salary related costs
2. Administrative Costs – funds utilized to support related costs of the child protection and welfare agency's administrative staff in directing the activities of the case management program.

2. Describe the Characteristics of Individuals to be Served

Include definitions for child, adult, and family; eligibility criteria; and income guidelines.

DCF's case management program serves:

- Child victims and suspected child victims of child abuse and/or neglect and their families, including children, youth, young adults, or families whose income is less than or equal to 200% of the federal poverty limit, and

- Children, youth, young adults, or families in need of child welfare services or child protective services, without regard to income. The individuals to be served are eligible for services "without regard to income" as a result of classification as "in need of protective services."

Children and youth are under the age of 18. Young adults are ages 18-21. A family represents members of the child's immediate household.

Although DCF initiates services based on suspected abuse or neglect without consideration of income, DCF's

Upon completion of that period, DCF will submit a Public Comment Certification to supplement this report. Should comments lead to changes to the state's intended uses, DCF will submit an amendment.

Services may be provided to individuals who voluntarily request services; and to all those who are reported to need protection because

Method of Delivery and Geographic Area DCF manages the State Central Registry (SCR), the statewide child abuse hotline that operates 24-hours a day, 7-days a week, taking calls from the public regarding children’s safety and well-being and providing a gateway for providing services. Specially trained screeners assess the situation, determine the appropriate response time, and assign the report to the designated local office intake unit or Institutional Abuse Investigative Unit. When a situation does not warrant investigation or assessment, the screener provides the caller with resources for accessing services as applicable.

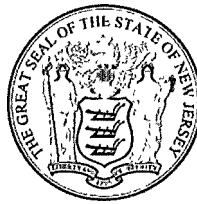

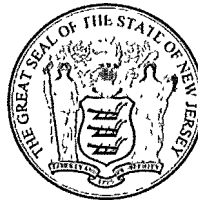
