# 2019 Healthy Centered Engagement Adolescent Advocacy Program Summit

DCF's Office of Adolescent Services hosted the 2019 Healthy Centered Engagement Adolescent Advocacy Program Summit at Mercer County College.



The keynote speaker, Dr. Farima Pour-Khorshid is an assistant professor and teacher supervisor at the University of San Francisco and a member of the radical healing team at Flourish Agenda. Dr. Pour-Khorshid addressed the topic of Healing Centered Engagement, an approach to trauma which expands how we think about responses to trauma and offers a holistic view which moves beyond "what happened to you" to "what's right with you".

The second presenter, Rachel Godsil is a Professor of Law and Chancellor's Scholar at Rutgers Law School and the Director of Research & Co-Founder of Perception Institute. Rachel discussed the topic of Implicit Bias, the brain's automatic and instant association of stereotypes or attitudes toward particular groups, often without conscious awareness.

Elevating the family voice to make a difference, 10. Intersections of violence and the impact on the child, and 11. Paid sick time is now the law in NJ.
