September was Kinship Awareness Month. The DCF's new strategic plan includes a transformative goal to preserve and expand kinship connections for NJ's youth in care. Studies show that when youth must be placed out-of-home care, kinship caregivers help keep them better connected to their family, their culture and their community. Kin ease

the transition by reducing trauma and adverse childhood experiences (ACEs). To advance these efforts, every DCF division and unit has submitted Objectives and Key Results proposals to increase and/or support kinship connections and placements. DCPP has also launched a pilot program in the four Monmouth and Ocean County Local Offices. Staff is eager to track progress in this important area.
