Agenda Overview

1. Federal Child and Family Services Review (CFSR)

- Purpose: To evaluate New Jersey's compliance with federal requirements regarding children and families.
- Components:

- The Statewide Assessment
 - Onsite Reviews
 - Program Improvement Plan Development
- Timeline: CFSR to be conducted every 5 years, the upcoming onsite review is scheduled for September 2025.

2. Current Projects and Initiatives

- Development of Training Curriculum: The subcommittee is preparing a draft outline for a curriculum focused on recognizing and reporting maltreatment.
- Focus on Stakeholder Engagement: Continual efforts are in place to involve a wide range of stakeholders in the planning and implementation of child welfare strategies.

3. Issues and Solutions Explored

- Addressing Child Poverty: The subcommittee is investigating measures to differentiate poverty from maltreatment in order to provide more tailored support to affected families. Strategies being considered include targeted interventions and collaborations with various community partners.
- Integrating Social Services: Enhancing the collaboration between agencies to ensure a more cohesive service delivery model.

Discussion Highlights

- **Data and Stakeholder Feedback**
 - The subcommittee is actively collecting data and preparing to engage with stakeholders to assess and address local needs.
 - Emphasis was placed on understanding the social determinants of family instability, including economic and racial disparities.
- **Program Improvement Planning**
 - A critical component of the meeting was dedicated to discussing the development of a comprehensive improvement plan, which will be formulated based on the CFSR findings and stakeholder input.
- **Next Steps**
 - Continue data collection efforts for the statewide assessment.
 - Identify required training and logistical requirements for the upcoming onsite review.
 - Engage in ongoing dialogue with stakeholders to foster transparency and inclusiveness.

The subcommittee is committed to improving the efficacy of New Jersey's child welfare systems. By leveraging data-driven insights and enhancing stakeholder collaboration, we aim to address the multifaceted challenges facing children and families across the state. Future communications will continue to inform the public of our progress and solicit input from all interested parties.
