Notice of Readoption Rulemaking Procedures

Take notice that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c, the rules at N.J.A.C. 3A:2 were scheduled to expire on April 17, 2024. The rules allow the Department of Children and Families (Department) to comply with New Jersey statutes and rules regarding rulemaking.

Subchapter 1 sets forth the chapter's purpose, scope, and definitions. Subchapter 2 describes the procedures and requirements for petitions for rulemaking. Subchapter 3 establishes the methods by which the Department may provide additional publicity of a notice of proposal and to whom the Department may send advance notice of rule proposals. Subchapter 4 sets forth the Department's requirements related to requests for extending the comment period on a notice of proposal. Subchapter 5 describes requirements for requesting and conducting a public hearing on a proposed rulemaking. Subchapter 6 sets forth the internet website address where the Department maintains its policies, procedures, forms, and form instructions.

The Department has reviewed the rules at N.J.A.C. 3A:2 and determined that the rules should be readopted without substantial changes; however, technical changes are needed at N.J.A.C. 3A:2-2.1(a) and 6.1 to update website addresses and weblinks. The rules are necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purposes for which they were originally promulgated. Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), these rules are readopted with technical changes and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.

Full text of the technical changes follows (additions indicated in boldface thus; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]):
