Medical facilities account for more than 8 percent of the total energy consumption in buildings across the U.S. and are estimated to generate more than 5 million tons of solid waste each year. This guide helps medical offices and hospitals evaluate their practices and take practical actions to increase their sustainability.

- Track monthly energy use.
- Turn off equipment when not in use, including medical equipment, computers and lights.
- Upgrade to LED lighting.
- When replacing equipment, look for ENERGY STAR® ratings.

CHEMICALS

- Avoid purchasing equipment and furniture that contain halogenated and brominated flame retardants.
- Avoid plastics or other products that contain PVC and BPA.
- Eliminate the use of mercury containing equipment.
- Switch to non-medicated hand soap.

WASTE

- Install recycling bins in your office and waiting room.
- Go paperless. Use electronic medical record systems and digital X-rays.
- Use cloth lab coats and exam gowns.
- Invest in rechargeable batteries for medical devices.

X-RAY FILM PROCESSORS

- Switch to digital imaging to eliminate the need for chemicals, films and water.
- Retrofit existing x-ray processors with automatic shut off values and a rinse effluent recycling system.
- Install flow regulators to limit the rinse water flow rate.

WATER



- Upgrade to WaterSense® products.
- Install amalgam and fluorine separators on dental office water disposal systems.
- Utilize drought resistant landscaping or smartcontrollers for irrigation systems.

STERILIZERS



- Upgrade to sterilizers with water recirculation and automatic shut off features.
- Install jacket and chamber condensate retrofit kits on older sterilizers to reduce water use.
- Switch to steam sterilization to reduce chemical use.
- Run sterilizers with full loads only.

PURCHASING



- Adopt a green purchasing policy.
- Buy recycled-content and lowtoxicity products.
- Choose products with a minimum amount of packaging and buy in bulk.
- Select products that are certified to meet reputable third party standards.

CLEANING



- Convert to green cleaning products certified by Safer Choice, GreenSeal, UL EcoLogo or GreenGuard.
- Select cleaning equipment that is energy efficient and uses less water and chemicals.
- Look for products that can be used in cold water to conserve energy.
