CERTIFICATION OF APPROVAL WITH MODIFICATION OF THE ATLANTIC COUNTY DISTRICT SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

BY ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONER:

A. Introduction

The New Jersey Solid Waste Management Act (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq. as amended by C. 326, Laws of 1975) determines, among other things, "...that the management of solid waste in New Jersey consists largely of piecemeal, uncoordinated activities developed to meet the immediate needs of local government with little, if any, regard for regional planning and coordination..." and that "...the solid waste planning and management process is adversely affected by the absence of area-wide structures.... The Act addressed these and other findings by establishing "...a statutory framework within which all solid waste collection, disposal and utilization activity..." in New Jersey would be coordinated. This framework includes the designation of each of New Jersey's twenty-one counties and the Hackensack Meadowlands District as a Solid Waste Management District. Each District is authorized, either singly or jointly with one or more other Districts, to formulate and develop a comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan. Following development, the resulting Plan is submitted by the District to the public for comment at an informational hearing. Thereafter, the District must adopt or reject, in whole or in part, the Solid Waste Management Plan.

After adoption of a Plan in whole or in part by a District, the Plan is then submitted to the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection for review and final approval. The Commissioner has authority to modify, reject or approve such Plans and, in the final analysis, the Commissioner is authorized to adopt and promulgate any modification or replacement he deems necessary with respect to the Solid Waste Management Plan.

In order to establish a meaningful and responsible role for the State in the solution of solid waste problems, the Act grants broad powers to the Department of Environmental Protection. This includes the power "...to regulate and supervise all solid waste collection and disposal facilities and operations...", "...to register all persons engaged in the collection or disposal of solid waste...", "...to develop through a Statewide solid waste management plan objectives, criteria and procedures to assure the orderly preparation and evaluation of the [district] solid waste management plans...", "...to approve, modify or reject such solid waste management plans on the basis of their conformity with such objectives, criteria and procedures...", and "...to develop and implement such a plan where none is approved or forthcoming from any solid waste management district..."

Specifically, the solid waste planning process includes five stages. These include the promulgation of guidelines by the Department of Environmental Protection, Plan formulation by the Districts, public hearings on the Plans developed by the Districts, adoption of the Plan by the District, and approval, rejection or modification of the Plan by the Department of Environmental Protection.

At the beginning of the planning process, the Department of Environmental Protection set forth guidelines for the formulation and development of District Solid Waste Management Plans.* The guidelines contain planning objectives, planning schedules and specific tasks to be addressed in the planning process. The objectives identified in the guidelines include the protection and enhancement of environmental quality and the conservation of natural resources. Through these objectives, the Department encouraged District Plans which would provide for the termination of existing solid waste disposal operations which cannot be upgraded to meet environmental standards, the provision of alternative services and facilities capable of meeting environmental standards and conservation of natural resources by the implementation of waste reduction techniques and resource recovery systems.

In order to achieve these objectives, the Department of Environmental Protection has and continues to encourage the development of a comprehensive regional scheme to ensure recovery systems and environmentally sound disposal facilities. To this end, the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection, after study and review, issued a Certification of Modification to the Adopted Solid Waste Management Plan of the Atlantic County Solid Waste Management District on November 7, 1980. The Certification required the Atlantic County Solid Waste Management District to, among other things, develop a schedule for resource recovery implementation and negotiate interdistrict agreements with other Solid Waste Management Districts for the use of disposal capacity.

On May 11, 1982, the Atlantic County Board of Chosen Freeholders formally adopted modifications to the District's Plan. The modifications were received by the Department of Environmental Protection on May 21, 1982. The ordinance adopting the modifications was received by the Department on May 26, 1982. The Department of Environmental Protection has studied and reviewed the Plan and its modifications in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Act. Department realizes that Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B. has a registration that includes various waste types, but does not include non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes. Although Lee's Gravel Pit did not seek, and therefore never obtained approval from the Department to accept type 27 wastes, it holds a tariff from the Board of Public Utilities to accept manufacturing wastes. The Department expects that Lee's Gravel Pit will seek and obtain permission for type 27 wastes to be included in its registration by the effective date of this Plan, October 1, 1982. Therefore, the Department has directed non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes to be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill. The Department also realizes that Burlington County has made an effort to enter into an interdistrict agreement with Atlantic County concerning the Burlington County municipalities of Bass River Township and Washington Township. In light of the transportation

1) Data Base

The basic data utilized in the Plan is approved. However, as further data, particularly in the area of solid waste generation and composition becomes available as part of the District's resource recovery feasibility studies, such data will supercede existing data, and be made part of any Plan revision or update.

2) Schedule for Resource Recovery Implementation

The Plan's schedule for the study and implementation of resource recovery is approved. The Department of Environmental Protection will monitor the progress of the District in meeting the milestones of this implementation schedule. The Atlantic County Utilities Authority shall make quarterly status reports to the Department of Environmental Protection concerning the District's progress in meeting these milestones. The first status report shall be submitted to the Department's Division of Waste Management by January 1, 1983.

3) Recycling/Source Separation Program

The recycling/source separation program outlined in the Plan is approved.

4) Terminated Landfills

The procedure outlined in the Plan for the use of terminated landfill sites is approved.

5) Public Participation Program

The Plan's public participation program is approved.

D. Modifications Adopted and Promulgated by the Commissioner Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq. and Made an Approved Part of the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan

I, Robert E. Hughey, Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq., do hereby adopt and promulgate the following modifications to the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan and certify to the Atlantic County Board of Chosen Freeholders that the modifications contained herein are hereby made a final approved part of the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan.

In-County Wastes

- a) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Buena shall be disposed of at the Buena Borough Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0104A, located in Buena Borough, Atlantic County, New Jersey.
- b) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and food processing (type 25) wastes and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County munici-

difficulties associated with bridge weight limitations in Mauling wastes from these townships to Burlington County solid waste facilities, Burlington County has petitioned the Department to allow these two municipalities to dispose of their wastes in Atlantic County. Therefore, the Department has directed Bass River Township to dispose of its wastes at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill upon closure of the Bass River Township Sanitary Landfill. Washington Township will continue to utilize the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill. Based on the results of this review and evaluation, I have determined that the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan be granted approval as amended by the modifications adopted herein and promulgated by me (see N.J.S.A. 13:1E-24).

B. Solid Waste Management Plan Accomplishments

The Atlantic County Solid Waste Management Plan has been reviewed by the Department of Environmental Protection and other State level agencies and, with the District's adopted modifications along with the replacement modifications herein set forth, provides for environmentally sound solid waste management in Atlantic County. I am confident that with the implementation of this Plan, a comprehensive solid waste management program will be established in Atlantic County.

The Plan provides for the construction of an 8-20 tons per day modular incinerator resource recovery facility to provide heating, cooling, and hot water at a new County correctional institution in Hamilton Township. Atlantic County will install and operate this facility.

The Plan also contains provisions for the development and expansion of source separation/recycling programs throughout the County. By October 1, 1982, a pilot program for voluntary recycling collection programs will be implemented by every municipality in Atlantic County's District One. By 1985, it is anticipated that mandatory County-wide source separation programs will divert the municipal waste stream by 25 percent.

In addition, the Plan contains a comprehensive public education and participation program and a schedule for the collection of more accurate solid waste generation and composition data.

Further, the Plan provides responsibilities for implementing the County Solid Waste Management Plan to be shared among the Atlantic County Utilities Authority, the Office of Solid Waste in the Atlantic County Division of Planning, and the Atlantic County Division of Public Health.

C. Approved Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan

I, Robert E. Hughey, Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq., do hereby approve the following key elements of the adopted Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan and the Modifications adopted by the Atlantic County Board of Chosen Freeholders on May 11, 1982.

pality of Buena Vista shall be disposed of at the Buena Vista Township Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0105C, located in Buena Vista Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All food processing (type 25) wastes and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Buena Vista shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).

- c) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and food processing (type 25) wastes and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Egg Harbor City shall be disposed of at the Egg Harbor City Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0107A, located in Egg Harbor City, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All food processing (type 25) wastes and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Egg Harbor City, shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).
- d) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Atlantic County municipalities of Absecon, Atlantic City, Brigantine, Egg Harbor Township, Linwood, Longport, Margate, Northfield, Pleasantville, Somers Point, and Ventnor shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).
- e) All bulky (type 13) wastes and vegetative (type 23) wastes collected by Robert T. Winzinger, Inc. shall be disposed of at the Winzinger Landfill, facility number 0108D, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.
- f) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and bulky (type 13) wastes, vegetative (type 23) wastes, food processing (type 25) wastes, and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipalities of Corbin City and Estell Manor shall be disposed of at the Estell Manor Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0109A, located in Estell Manor City, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All bulky (type 13) wastes, vegetative (type 23) wastes, food processing (type 25) wastes, and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Estell Manor, shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).
- g) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and food processing (type 25) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Folsom shall be disposed of at the Folsom Borough Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0110A, located in Folsom Borough, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All food processing (type 25) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Folsom shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit

landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.

- h) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and food processing (type 25) wastes and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Galloway shall be disposed of at the Galloway Township-Oak Avenue landfill, facility number O111B, located in Galloway Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey or the Galloway Township-Hershel Street landfill, facility number O111D, located in Galloway Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey, pending a possible decision to assign wastes from specific portions of the Township to specific solid waste facilities. All food processing (type 25) wastes and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Galloway shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).
- i) All bulky (type 13) wastes and vegetative (type 23) wastes generated at Stockton State College shall be disposed of at the Stockton State College landfill, facility number OlliE, located in Galloway Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.
- j) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Hamilton shall be disposed of at the Hamilton Township Sanitary Landfill-Somers Point Road, facility number 0112B, located in Hamilton Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Hamilton shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).
- k) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Hammonton shall be disposed of at the Hammonton Municipal Landfill, facility number Oll3A, located in Hammonton Town, Atlantic County, New Jersey.
- 1) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Mullica shall be disposed of at the Mullica Township Landfill, facility number 0117A, located in Mullica Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.
- m) Compost facility currently operating in Atlantic County, New Jersey and accepting vegetative wastes: Harry Cummings Compost Facility, facility number 0118A, located in Northfield City.
- n) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and food processing (type 25) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Port Republic shall be disposed of at the Port Republic City Landfill, facility number 0120A, located in Port Republic City, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All

close by January 1, 1984) wastes going to this facility shall be disposed of at the Estell Manor Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0109A.*

- u) Upon closure of the Buena Borough Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0104A, (the facility identified in this section shall, according to the modifications adopted and promulgated herein, close by January 1, 1984) wastes going to this facility shall be disposed of at the Buena Vista Township Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0105C.*
- v) The Atlantic County Plan adopted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders provides for the Hamilton Township Sanitary Landfill-Somers Point Road, facility number 0112B to begin expansion and upgrading in January 1984 or to close by January 1, 1984. The County shall amend its Plan no later than January 1, 1983 providing for either option concerning the Hamilton site.*
- w) It is anticipated that Lee's Gravel Pit will seek and obtain approvation acceptance of non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes by the effective date of these Modifications, October 1, 1982 (see Section A). In the event that Lee's Gravel Pit does not petition the Department to include type 27 in its landfill registration, and if it is not authorized to accept type 27 wastes by the effective date of these Modifications, the Department will redirect type 27 wastes accordingly.

2) Out-of-County Wastes

- a) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Cape May County municipality of Ocean City shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey until completion of the new Cape May County regional landfill directed to be operational by January 1, 1983.
- b) Upon closure of the Bass River Township Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0301A, located in Bass River Township, Burlington County, New Jersey, all solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Burlington County municipality of Bass River shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.
- c) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein, generated from within the Burlington County municipality of Washington shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.

^{*}In the event that any existing landfill reaches capacity or develops operational problems requiring enforcement actions, it may be closed at an earlier date.

food processing (type 25) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Port Republic shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey.

- o) All solid wastes, with the exception of those noted in Section 4.c. herein and vegetative (type 23) wastes, food processing (type 25) wastes, and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes, generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Weymouth shall be disposed of at the Weymouth Township Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0123A, located in Weymouth Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey. All vegetative (type 23) wastes, food processing (type 25) wastes, and non-chemical industrial (type 27) wastes generated from within the Atlantic County municipality of Weymouth shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, located in Egg Harbor Township, Atlantic County, New Jersey (see D.1.w.).
- p) Upon closure of the Winzinger Landfill, facility number 0108D, (the facility identified in this section shall, according to the modifications adopted and promulgated herein, close by January 1, 1984) wastes going to this facility shall be disposed of at the Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B.*
- q) Upon closure of Lee's Gravel Pit landfill, facility number 0108B, (the facility identified in this section shall, according to the modifications adopted and promulgated herein, close by December 31, 1985) all solid wastes going to this facility shall be disposed of at the regional County landfill which is to be operational by January 1, 1986.*
- r) Upon closure of the Galloway Township-Hershel Street landfill, facility number 0111D; the Stockton State College landfill, facility number 0111E; the Egg Harbor City Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0107A; and the Port Republic City Landfill, facility number 0120A, (the four facilities identified in this section shall, according to the modifications adopted and promulgated herein, close by January 1, 1984) wastes going to these facilities (with the addition of the municipality of Absecon) shall be disposed of at the Galloway Township-Oak Avenue landfill, facility number 0111B.*
- s) Upon closure of the Folsom Borough Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0110A and the Mullica Township Landfill, facility number 0117A, (the two facilities identified in this section shall, according to the modifications adopted and promulgated herein, close by January 1, 1984) wastes going to these facilities shall be disposed of at the Hammonton Municipal Landfill, facility number 0113A.*
- t) Upon closure of the Weymouth Township Sanitary Landfill, facility number 0123A, (the facility identified in this section shall, according to the modifications adopted and promulgated herein,

the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan if such renegotiation is not completed by the effective date of these Modifications (October 1, 1982); provided, however, that any such registrant may, upon application to the Department of Environmental Protection and for good cause shown, obtain an extension of time to complete such renegotiation.

b) Compliance

All solid waste facility operators registered with the Department of Environmental Protection and operating within Atlantic County and effected by the Modifications contained herein shall operate in compliance with these Modifications and all other approved provisions of the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan. Any facility operator who fails to comply with the provisions contained herein shall be deemed to be in violation of N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq., in violation of N.J.A.C. 7:26-1 et seq., and in violation of their registration to operate a solid waste facility issued thereunder by the Department of Environmental Protection and shall be subject to the provisions and penalties of N.J.S.A. 13:1E-9, 10 and 12 and all other applicable laws.

c) Types of Solid Wastes Covered by the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan Modifications

The Modifications contained herein shall apply to all "solid wastes" generated within the identified County municipalities, as defined in N.J.S.A. 13:1E-3 and N.J.A.C. 7:26-2.5.27 and with the exceptions of liquid wastes, sewage sludge, septage, hazardous wastes, oil spill clean-up waste, infectious waste and those wastes separated and recovered at the point of generation.

d) <u>Certification to Proceed with the Implementation of Plan Modi</u>fications

This Document shall serve as the Certification of the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection to the Atlantic County Board of Chosen Freeholders, as provided for by N.J.S.A. 13:1E-24f., to proceed with the implementation of the Modifications contained herein.

e) Definitions

For the purpose of these Modifications and unless the context clearly requires a different meaning, the definitions of terms shall be the same as those found at N.J.S.A. 13:1E-3 and N.J.A.C. 7:26-1.4 and -2.5.27.*

^{*}Note: In a municipal collection system where commercial and residential solid wastes are collected together, the wastes shall be considered, for the purposes of District solid waste planning, as residential solid waste.

3) Other Modifications

- a) The Department approves of the procedure outlined in the Plan which recognizes the need to uniformly distribute costs throughout the District so as to reflect the environmental costs of improving solid waste facilities and provide for the orderly flow of waste. It is the Department's position, however, that the County must obtain uniform disposal rate approval from the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities.
- b) Atlantic County shall construct a new regional landfill on, or prior to, January 1, 1986. The Atlantic County Utilities Authority shall submit quarterly progress reports to the Department outlining progress made in meeting these milestones. The first report will be due on January 1, 1983. A more detailed schedule is required to be submitted to the Department in the first two-year Plan update.
- A closed or terminated landfill may be disrupted in the event of an emergency or if the Department deems it necessary. If disruption does prove necessary, then these wastes will be directed to available facilities as determined by the Department in consultation with Atlantic County.
- d) The Plan shall conform with any Rules and Regulations of the Department concerning sludge and septage.

4) Other Provisions Effecting the Plan Modifications

a) <u>Contracts</u>

Nothing contained in these Modifications shall be construed as to interfere with, or in any way modify, the provisions of any contract for solid waste collection or solid waste disposal in force in any solid waste management district upon the effective date of this Act (July 29, 1977); provided, however, as set forth at N.J.S.A. 13:1E-29 no renewal of any such contract upon the expiration or termination of the original term thereof, and no new contract for solid waste collection or solid waste disposal, shall be entered into after the effective date of this act, unless such renewal or such new contract shall conform with the applicable provisions of the approved solid waste management plan, as set forth herein, of the relevant solid waste management district or unless such contract is approved by the Commissioner.

Any contract renewal or new contract for solid waste collection or solid waste disposal which was executed prior to the approval of the within modifications to the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan and subsequent to the effective date of the Solid Waste Management Act (July 29, 1977), and which shall further be for a term in excess of one year, shall immediately be renegotiated in order to bring same into conformance with the terms and provisions herein set forth. Any solid waste collection operation or disposal facility registered by the Department of Environmental Protection and operating pursuant to a contract as herein described, shall be deemed to be in violation of these Modifications and of

f) Effective Date of Modifications



The adopted and promulgated Modifications to the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan contained herein shall take effect on October 1, 1982.

- other action taken by the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to its authority under the law. The Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan shall conform with the Statewide Solid Waste Management Plan. The Statewide Solid Waste Management Plan. The Statewide Solid Waste Management Plan includes the Department's Planning Guidelines and rules, regulations, and orders of the Department, and will include the compilation of individual District Plans and modifications as they are approved.**
- E. Certification of Approval and Adoption and Promulgation of Modifications by the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection

In accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 13:1E-1 et seq., I hereby approve the Atlantic County District Solid Waste Management Plan and its adopted modifications, subject to the modifications and replacements contained and adopted herein.
