#### Dear Marine Fisheries Stakeholders and Interested Parties:

The New Jersey Marine Fisheries Council (Council) is looking for qualified candidates to serve as advisors to the Council's species-specific Committees. If you are interested in becoming more involved with the fishery management process in New Jersey, we are accepting applications for advisory positions to be reviewed by Council. The application is available online at <a href="https://www.nj.gov/dep/fgw/pdf/mfc\_advisor\_app.pdf">https://www.nj.gov/dep/fgw/pdf/mfc\_advisor\_app.pdf</a>. Advisors play a key role in deciding fishing regulations and policy in New Jersey, so the Council has developed some guidelines for their appointment and participation, including:

- Advisors serve a three-year term and may apply for renewal at the end of their term (no automatic renewal).
- Advisors must be actively engaged in the harvesting or processing of, or knowledgeable or interested in the conservation and management of, the commercial or recreational fisheries to be managed.
- Advisors are expected to make every effort to attend all meetings.
- Advisors are encouraged to speak with constituents in their area/port, organization, or fishery (ex. for-hire, commercial trawler) and provide input from the community they represent at committee meetings and not just provide input from their own perspective.
- Advisors are expected to uphold the mission and responsibilities of the Council, with disciplinary consequences for advisors who receive fishing violations.
- Advisors' names, affiliation, and hometown will be posted on the Division website under the Marine Fisheries Council page for public information.

A complete description of the advisor guidelines is available in the New Jersey Marine Fisheries Council Administrative Guidelines document on the Council website (<a href="https://www.nj.gov/dep/fgw/pdf/marine/mfc">https://www.nj.gov/dep/fgw/pdf/marine/mfc</a> guidelines.pdf; updated 11/2018).

All advisor applications will be reviewed by the Council's Executive Committee, as well as the chair of the appropriate Council committee, before a final determination is made by the full Council. Review criteria may include (but are not limited to) sector representation, regional (geographic) representation, fishing history/knowledge of key issues, enforcement history, and available advisor positions. The goal of the application and review process is to ensure that advisors to a given committee reflect the varied viewpoints of the fishery with respect to geographical, sector/gear, social, and economic standpoints.

Stakeholder participation is a key element of a successful management program. The Council depends on participation from advisors to guide committees in developing fishery policy and management options that meet the needs of our stakeholders while maintaining compliance with appropriate fishery management plans.
