


My Family Tree & Me

The study of history usual means learning about people and the lives they lived in the past. Most of us don't think about ourselves when we learn about, or talk about, history. While it's true that history is the study of the past, it is also about us, our families, relatives and ancestors. This special kind of family history is called genealogy. Every family is connected to the larger story of the past. You are part of the story! Your parents, brothers and sisters, half-brothers and sisters, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins are part of the larger story of our country.



Not everyone has the same kind of family. Some live with a mom and dad, others just a mother, father, aunt, uncle or grandparent and some may have two moms or two dads. It isn't important if your family isn't like mine or your best friend's because no matter who you call "family," they are all part of your own story.

Let's tell that story – YOUR family story! This history activity can help you discover your family's unique story. Begin by growing your **own family tree** like the one pictured above. Start by putting your name in the middle and then add your family members – who they are and their names – in any order you like *(there may be too many circles or not enough; feel free to add your own if you need more)*. Ask your family members for help if you need it. After you are done with that then add information about yourself by answering the questions on the **"Stuff About Me"** pages. When that's done have a little fun with the **family description page** by noting which family member is the most fun, the cleanest, the tallest, the best cook, etc.




And finally, it's time to learn more about your family members. The "Family Member Questionnaire" page can help you with that task. Here you will find a list of suggested questions you can ask individual family members to learn more about them. This section of this history activity is done with your family. Find a time when you can have a conversation with one or several family members. Ask them questions about themselves and write down their answers or record the interview if you want. Their answers will help you discover their part of your larger family story. You may learn about relatives you never met!

Take your time and don't worry - there is no wrong way to do this activity. And remember to have fun writing your story and discovering your family history!

What follows is a list of questions that will help you to tell the story of your family. Use this list as an aid to help discover your own family history and stories. You can record the interview if you want. It's amazing what you can learn about your family when you sit down with an older relative (Mom, Dad, Aunt, Uncle, Grandparent, Cousin, etc.) and start asking them questions. You may not get to ask all the questions below and that's OK! In fact, you will probably find that that one memory will automatically lead into another question. Look at the list and start with the questions you'd most like to ask. The list is meant to be used as a guide. Go ahead skip questions you don't like and feel free to add your own. Learning about your family should be enjoyable as well as informative so remember to HAVE FUN being the family historian!

- 10. What would you consider to be the most important inventions that have been made during your lifetime?
- 11. How is the world now different from what it was like when you were growing up?
- 12. What kinds of books did you like to read?
- 13. What were your favorite toys and what were they like?
- 14. What were your favorite childhood games?
