## Find Healthcare Heroes at Home

Healthcare heroes are making history in New Jersey today. Think about the healthcare heroes in your life. Who provides healthcare to others? Who provides essential care to you? They are nurses, doctors, and medical staff at hospitals and doctor's offices but they are also essential workers at grocery stores, restaurants, schools, libraries, and parks and family and friends caring for you at home.

Choose a healthcare hero you know and ask for an interview. If you cannot meet in person, you may wish to talk over the phone or online. Ask questions about the work your healthcare hero provides and how the health emergency has affected that work.

- How has the health emergency affected your job?
- What makes you nervous or anxious about your work?
- What makes you hopeful or determined to carry on your work?

Draw a picture or take a photograph of your healthcare hero. Write a short paragraph about your healthcare hero like the "Healthcare Heroes in History" from Highlights from our Historians.
