Notice of Administrative Correction Examination Charge and Per Diem Rate

## N.J.A.C. 3:1-6.7

<u>Take notice</u> that the Office of Administrative Law discovered an error in N.J.A.C. 3:1-6.7, as amended effective June 19, 2006. At 38 N.J.R. 5(a), the reference to "license fee" in the first sentence of N.J.A.C. 3:1-6.7(a) was proposed for deletion. However, in the original and published notice of adoption for that proposal, the term "license fee" was inadvertently not deleted and appeared as current rule text. See R. 2006 d. 233 and 38 N.J.R. 2671(a). Through this notice of administrative correction, published pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:30-2.7, the adopted deletion of the term is effected.

Full text of the corrected rule follows (deletion indicated in brackets [thus]):

3:1-6.7 Failure to pay fees or examination charges

(a) If a person pays an examination charge, application fee, [license fee] or any other fee or charge, other than an assessment made under N.J.A.C. 3:5, with a check which is returned for insufficient funds or is not paid for any other reason, the Department shall advise the person by letter. The person shall have 20 days from the date of such letter to provide the Department with a certified or cashier's check payable to the Treasurer, State of New Jersey for the amount of the dishonored check plus \$10.00. If the Department does not receive a certified or cashier's check within 20 days of the date of this letter, the Department shall suspend the license of the person or the authority of the person to conduct business in this State until payment by certified or cashier's check is received. N.J.A.C. 3:1-7.6(b) shall apply to all returned checks submitted in payment of assessments imposed pursuant to N.J.A.C. 3:5.
