**ORDER OF FINAL JUDGMENT

Defendant, Norman F. Long ("Defendant"), having been
duly served with a copy of the Summons and Complaint in the above-
captioned action, and default having been entered for Defendant's
failure to appear, answer, or otherwise defend;

and for the reasons placed on the record;

This Court now finds that Defendant presented and caused
to be presented written statements in support of a claim for
payment pursuant to an insurance policy knowing that the statements
contained false information regarding material facts, in violation

of the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 to -30 ("Fraud Act"). Specifically, Defendant (i) through insurance adjusters, knowingly caused a fake invoice to be presented to support his claim for damage to his home pursuant to an insurance policy, in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(1), and (ii) knowingly submitted to an insurance company a fake letter and fake invoice in support of his claim for damage to his home pursuant to an insurance policy, in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(1).

FINAL JUDGMENT is on this 24th day of July 2020, entered in the amount of \$14,142.00 against Defendant and in favor of Plaintiff, Marlene Caride, Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance. This amount consists of \$10,000.00 in civil penalties for two (2) violations of the Fraud Act pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); attorneys' fees of \$2,977.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); cost of service in the amount of \$165.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5; and a statutory fraud surcharge of \$1,000.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5.1.
