ORDER FOR FINAL JUDGMENT BY DEFAULT

THIS MATTER HAVING BEEN opened to the Court on the application of Matthew J. Platkin, Attorney General of New Jersey, (by Sean Healy, Deputy Attorney General, appearing), attorney for Plaintiff, Justin Zimmerman, Acting Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance on a motion for final judgment by default; and

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Defendant, Monifa Bourjolly ("Defendant"), having been duly served with a copy of the Summons and Complaint in the abovecaptioned action, and default having been entered for Defendant's failure to appear, answer, or otherwise defend;

This Court now finds that Defendant violated the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 to -30 ("Fraud Act"), specifically N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(1), N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(3)(a) and (b), N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(4)(a), N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(4)(b), and N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(5) by providing false and misleading statements on an application for automobile insurance with Progressive Garden State Insurance Company ("Progressive") on or about June 29, 2022 by knowingly failing to disclose her correct residential address and the primary garage location of the insured vehicle, and by knowinly failing to disclose that Khalil Samuel was a regular operator of the vehicle; and therefore

FINAL JUDGMENT is on this 16th day of May, 2024, entered in the amount of \$18,500.00 against Defendant, and in favor of Plaintiff, Justin Zimmerman, Acting Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance. This amount consists of \$15,000.00 in civil penalties for two violations of the Fraud Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); attorneys' fees of

\$2,500.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); and a statutory fraud surcharge of \$1,000.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5.1.
