THIS MATTER HAVING BEEN opened to the Court on the Application of Matthew J. Platkin, Attorney General of New Jersey, (by Reciton Pahumi, Deputy Attorney General, appearing), attorney for Plaintiff, Justin Zimmerman, Acting Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance on a motion for final judgment by default; and

Defendant, Keira Wilkins ("Defendant"), having been duly served with a copy of the Summons and Complaint in the above-captioned action, and default having been entered for Defendant's failure to appear, answer, or otherwise, defend;

This Court now finds that Defendant violated the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 to -30 ("Fraud Act") by making oral and written statements to an insurance company for the purpose of obtaining an insurance policy, and so her insurance claim would be paid, knowing the statements contained false or misleading information.

Specifically, Defendant falsely represented to an insurance company in order to obtain an insurance policy, and so her insurance claim would be paid, that she resided and garaged her vehicle in Sicklerville, New Jersey when, in fact, knowingly misrepresenting that she resided and garaged her vehicle in New Jersey, when in fact, Defendant was residing and garaging the policy vehicle in Amityville, New York, she resided and garaged her vehicle in New York, in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(1), -4(a)(3), -4(a)(4)(a), and -4(a)(4)(b); and

FINAL JUDGMENT is on this ~~26th~~ day of ~~July~~ 2024, entered in the amount of \$8,611.00 against Defendant and in favor of Plaintiff, Justin Zimmerman, Acting Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance. This amount consists of \$5,000.00 in civil penalties for two (2) violations of the Fraud Act pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); attorneys' fees of \$2,611.00

pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); and a statutory fraud surcharge of \$1,000.00
pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5.1.
