WHEREAS Plaintiff, Justin Zimmerman, Acting Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance ("Plaintiff" or "Commissioner"), and Defendant, Amanda Boyer ("Defendant") (collectively, "Parties"), have reached an amicable agreement resolving the issues in controversy, and consented to the entry of the within Stipulation of Settlement ("Settlement").

WHEREAS the Parties have determined and hereby agree that settlement is in each of their best interests, and for good cause shown.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree fully and finally to settle this matter pursuant to the terms and conditions below.

- 1. Defendant, Amanda Boyer, presented her claim for damages in good faith and did not intend to violate N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4 but now realizes that there was a violation of the Act.
- 2. Any future violations of the Act shall be considered second and subsequent violations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b).
- 3. Defendant agrees that she shall not engage in any future violations of the Act.
- 4. Defendant shall pay a total judgment of \$1,050 to the Commissioner ("Settlement Amount"). This Settlement Amount consists of \$1,000 in civil penalties, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b), and a \$50 statutory surcharge, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5.1.
- 5. Defendant shall satisfy the judgment in favor of the Commissioner upon the following terms and conditions:
- a. Immediately upon execution of this Stipulation of Settlement by Defendant, Defendant shall remit to the attorney for the Commissioner a payment in the amount of \$1,050.00 by certified check, official bank check, or money order made payable to the

"Commissioner, New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance" and sent to:

- 6. No representation, inducement, promise, understanding, condition, or warranty not set forth in this Settlement has been made to or relied upon by Defendant in agreeing to this Settlement. Defendant represents that this Settlement is freely and voluntarily entered into without any degree of duress or compulsion.
- 7. The Parties agree that each Party shall bear its own legal and other costs incurred in connection with this matter, and no additional attorneys' fees or costs shall be due, except Defendant agrees to pay Plaintiff's attorneys' fees pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b) as described above in paragraph 4, and all reasonable costs of collection and enforcement of this Settlement, including attorneys' fees and expenses.
- 8. For purposes of construction, this Settlement shall be deemed drafted by all Parties to this Settlement and therefore

shall not be construed against any Party for that reason in any subsequent dispute.

- 9. The undersigned counsel and any other signatories represent and warrant that they are fully authorized to execute this Settlement on behalf of the persons indicated below.

- 12. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-10(c), a copy of this Stipulation of Settlement shall be provided to any appropriate licensing authority.
- 13. This Stipulation of Settlement may be used in any subsequent civil or criminal proceedings.

14. The penalties of this Settlement are imposed pursuant to the police powers of the State of New Jersey for the enforcement of the law and protection of the public health, safety, and welfare, and are not intended to constitute debts which may be limited or discharged in a bankruptcy proceeding.
