

Commission adopted Resolution 2024 – 05 Creating a Subcommittee on Source Water Protection (SSWP)

- 1. No comments during public input process
- Subcommittee of the Water Management Advisory Committee (WMAC)
- 3. DRBC staff liaison: Chad Pindar, *Manager, Water Resource Planning*



From the Resolution -

The primary objectives of the SSWP are:

- 1. Knowledge sharing and regional dialogue.
- 2. Focus on drinking water protection.
- Promote and support the Delaware Valley Early Warning System (EWS).



The SSWP may establish other objectives as appropriate:

- 1. Identify priority issues, topics and measures and initiatives.
- 2. Coordinate approaches for SWP funding.
- 3. Coordinate with other groups such as the SAN.



The SSWP has six (6) reserved members:





2. State of New Jersey



3. State of New York



4. Commonwealth of Pennsylvania pennsylvania pennsylvania



Agency



6. City of Philadelphia





Eligible non-reserved members:

- Drinking water utilities that obtain their source water from and provide service to customers within the Delaware River Basin
- Drinking water utilities that obtain their source water from the Delaware and Raritan Canal.
- 3. One vote per organization.
- 4. No limit on the number on non-reserved members

Other terms in the Resolution:

- 1. Elect a Chair and a Vice Chair
- 2. Establish task- or working groups if needed
- 3. All meetings of the SSWP shall be open to the public
- 4. Meet at least once per calendar year
- 5. Unless renewed, the SSWP shall expire three years from the effective date of the Resolution



The next steps include:

- 1. Form the subcommittee
 - Eligible and interested? Let us know by July 26, 2024.
- 2. Schedule a meeting Q4 2024. Where?
- 3. Solicit topics and agenda items for first meeting
- 4. Survey?
- 5. Small meeting planning group?


