Principals of public or nonpublic schools in New Jersey **may nominate one outstanding junior or senior** to be considered for this highly competitive, merit-based program. A Blue Ribbon Panel will select two delegates and two alternates from the statewide applicants.

A candidate must currently be serving in an elected or appointed position in a student government, civic or educational organization. Additional criteria may be found by reading the attached materials and reviewing information posted at http://nj.gov/education/clear/students/syp/.

Two students from each state, the District of Columbia, and the Department of Defense Schools will be selected to participate in the week-long government leadership program in Washington, D.C. from March 3-10, 2012. The Hearst Foundation will pay all expenses for the week in Washington, including transportation, hotel, and meals. Students selected will also be eligible to receive a one-time \$5,000 undergraduate college scholarship from the Hearst Foundation. The alternates attend the week in Washington only if the delegates are unable to participate.

Please note that in order to ensure consideration of your nominee, the attached application form and associated materials must be complete and received by mail no later than **October 14, 2011**.
