Subject: School Nutrition Program and Effects of Hurricane Irene

In light of the many flooding issues resulting from Hurricane Irene, the USDA is prepared to assist schools participating in the School Nutrition Programs as much as possible. However, first-hand knowledge of what problems are out there is required. Therefore, if you are dealing with issues from Hurricane Irene affecting the federal school nutrition programs in any way, please communicate with our office as indicated below.

## For example:

- Have any school nutrition program records been lost or destroyed?
- Have any commodity food items been lost or destroyed?
- Are any of your students displaced from their homes?
  - Note: Students that have been displaced and are currently staying in shelters or in another household, can be considered as "homeless" if verified as such by the school district's homeless liaison.
  - o These homeless students (as a result of Hurricane Irene) are categorically eligible for free meals. However, as of now this status would be considered to be <u>temporary</u>, until further guidance is issued by USDA.
- Any difficulty getting deliveries of all required meal components?
