2020-2021 State Seal of Biliteracy Program

The 2020-2021 school year is the fifth year that the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) will offer the option for graduating high school students to attain the <u>State Seal of Biliteracy</u> by demonstrating proficiency in English and one or more world languages.

Due to the impact of COVID-19, the following modifications have been made to the process for students to demonstrate proficiency in English and one or more world languages:

- A student may demonstrate proficiency by taking an <u>approved world-language assessment</u> using parent/guardian proctoring, computer-based proctoring, or school-based proctoring.
- The scores from the Advanced Placement (AP) exam given in Spring 2020 cannot be used to demonstrate
 proficiency in a world language. The spring 2020 administration of the AP exam was truncated and did not
 assess all four language domains (i.e., reading, writing, speaking, listening) as required by N.J.A.C. 18A:7C-15.
- Executive Order 214 (Murphy, 2021) waives the statutory graduation assessment requirement mandated by N.J.S.A. 18A:7C-1 et seq. for the 2020-2021 school year for any 12thgrade student who has not yet satisfied the assessment requirement but has met all credit, curriculum, and attendance requirements for graduation. The district should submit a statement of assurance (SOA), which will be disseminated by the County Offices of Education, indicating that any such student has demonstrated proficiency in the New Jersey Student Learning Standards-English Language Arts through local assessment(s) administered on campus or virtually. For students who have not previously demonstrated English proficiency through the New Jersey Student Learning Assessment or ACCESS, the SOA serves this purpose. The district Biliteracy Coordinator should email their respective county education specialist for the SOA.

Students who attain this distinction will receive an NJDOE-issued certificate and transcript notation indicating the receipt of the Seal of Biliteracy.
