9/11 Memorial & Museum Offers Free Professional Development to NJ Schools

Educating students about the September 11, 2001 (9/11) attacks offers vital insights into contemporary global dynamics, shaping students' understanding of recent history and current events. Additionally, teaching about 9/11 offers an opportunity to discuss themes of resilience, unity, and the importance of cross-cultural dialogue in an increasingly interconnected world. Educators play a vital role in ensuring that students understand the significance of this historical moment while fostering compassion and informed citizenship.

The 2020 New Jersey Student Learning Standards for Social Studies require instruction on the events of 9/11. We encourage educators to teach about the events and aftermath of September 11, 2001, in a manner that is sensitive to the individual and community experiences of their districts. In order to assist educators in addressing this subject, the 9/11 Memorial & Museum features a variety of free resources and has designed two unique professional development experiences exclusively for New Jersey educators.

- Virtual Professional Development for NJ Educators

 - Take an interactive, virtual tour of the Museum and discover free, classroom-ready resources that explore the human impact of 9/11 and help students understand the continuing legacy of the attacks. This workshop is appropriate for 3rd-12th grade educators and will be conducted over Zoom.
