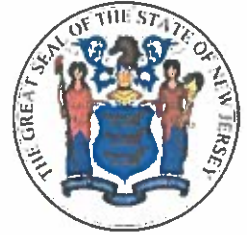

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ADOPTED MARCH 10, 1994

Sponsored by Senators EWING, McGREEVEY and SINAGRA

1 AN ACT regarding genocide education in the public schools and
2 supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey
3 Statutes.

4
5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
6 State of New Jersey:

7 1. The Legislature finds and declares that:

8 a. New Jersey has recently become the focal point of national
9 attention for the most venomous and vile of ethnic hate speeches.

10 b. There is an inescapable link between violence and vandalism
11 and ethnic and racial intolerance. The New Jersey Department
12 of Education itself has formally recognized the existence of the
13 magnitude of this problem in New Jersey schools by the
14 formation of a Commissioner's Task Force on Violence and
15 Vandalism.

16 c. New Jersey is proud of its enormous cultural diversity. The
17 teaching of tolerance must be made a priority if that cultural
18 diversity is to remain one of the State's strengths.

19 d. National studies indicate that fewer than 25% of students
20 have an understanding of organized attempts throughout history
21 to eliminate various ethnic groups through a systematic program
22 of mass killing or genocide.

23 e. The New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education,
24 created pursuant to P.L.1991, c.193 (C.18A:4A-1 et seq.), several
25 years ago expanded its mission to study and recommend
26 curricular material on a wide range of genocides. The Holocaust
27 Commission is an ideal agency to recommend curricular materials
28 to local districts.

29 2. a. Every board of education shall include instruction on the
30 Holocaust and genocides in an appropriate place in the curriculum
31 of all elementary and secondary school pupils.

32 b. The instruction shall enable pupils to identify and analyze
33 applicable theories concerning human nature and behavior; to
34 understand that genocide is a consequence of prejudice and
35 discrimination; and to understand that issues of moral dilemma
36 and conscience have a profound impact on life. The instruction
37 shall further emphasize the personal responsibility that each
38 citizen bears to fight racism and hatred whenever and wherever
39 it happens.

40 3. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply
41 to curriculum offerings in the 1994-95 school year.

NEW JERSEY HOLOCAUST/GENOCIDE EDUCATION 1973 – 2019



INTRODUCTION

Holocaust education in New Jersey began in 1973 through a cooperative effort between the New Jersey Department of Education and two local school districts. In the summer of 1978, the New Jersey Department of Education commissioned the staff of the two high school districts to jointly write a curriculum guide and anthology for students that could serve as a basis for instruction on the Holocaust in New Jersey. The next phase of Holocaust education began in 1982, when New Jersey Governor Thomas Kean created the New Jersey Advisory Council on Holocaust Education, by an executive order. The core mission of the New Jersey Advisory Council on Holocaust Education was to be carried out through recommendations to the Commissioner of Education to facilitate and implement Holocaust education objectives through programs and curricula in the schools of New Jersey. The advisory council was further charged with creating an awareness of the subject among the general public. In 1990, the council initiated efforts to make the council a permanent state entity. Therefore, in June 1991, Governor Florio signed legislation creating a permanent Commission on Holocaust Education. In the spring of 1994, New Jersey Governor Christine Todd Whitman signed into law a bill that required the inclusion of instruction on the Holocaust and genocide into the elementary and high school curriculum of every public school district in the state. The New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education developed and disseminated to every school district a copy of a recommended curriculum for elementary grades (K-8) and secondary grades (9-12). In 1996, the commission authorized its curriculum and education committee to design a comprehensive survey for the purpose of determining the degree to which the Holocaust and genocide mandate had been implemented in New Jersey. The following report is in relation to the activities and results that have occurred since the passage of the Holocaust/genocide mandate in the spring of 1994. The chronology of events includes:

- 1973:** Holocaust education in New Jersey began in 1973 through a cooperative effort between the New Jersey Department of Education and two local school districts.
- 1975:** The school districts of Teaneck and Vineland begin to study about and develop curriculum "Man's Inhumanity to Man" (A Holocaust/Genocide Curriculum). Department of Education agrees to support districts efforts in development of the curriculum and workshop presentations.
- 1976 – 1982:** With the support of the Department of Education the curriculum was developed and workshops presented around the state with the assistance of the ADL of New Jersey. State Board of Education recommends inclusion of Holocaust genocide studies in the schools of New Jersey. Dr. Deborah Wolfe made the motion which was seconded by Maud Dahme and passed unanimously.

- 1982:** Governor Thomas Kean announces intent to create a New Jersey Holocaust Council which is the first in the country and was made official on October 7, 1982. A survey is conducted regarding Holocaust/genocide studies in the schools of New Jersey.
- 1982 – 1991:** Holocaust Council operates for ten (10) years under a yearly executive order signed by Governors Kean and Florio. Holocaust/Genocide Centers begin to emerge joining those already operational. (Brookdale Community College, Ramapo College, JCC of Metro West, Seton Hall University and Trenton {TCNJ} State College).
- 1991:** Legislation is introduced, passed and signed by Governor Florio at Rider University during a Holocaust seminar in June, 1991 establishing a permanent Commission on Holocaust Education.
- 1991 – 1994:** A revised and new curriculum (K-8 and 9-12) is developed building on the original Teaneck/Vineland model and is presented in workshops and seminars throughout the state. A special legislative appropriation is provided to present to every school a curriculum guide for grades K-8 and 9-12. Additional guides are developed for the Armenian, Cambodian, Ukrainian and Native American genocides and for the Irish Famine Atrocity.
- 1994:** After years of deliberation by the Commission and almost 12 months of hearings, compromises and debates, legislation is passed mandating the teaching of Holocaust and Genocide education in all public schools of New Jersey. (Over the years most private and parochial schools have incorporated the studies in their curriculum)
- 1995 -2000:** A third version of the curriculum is developed, presented in workshops and distributed to all schools. This time the organization of the guides was for K-4, 5-8 and 9-12 grades. A survey was conducted to ascertain level of compliance with the mandate. A master's thesis on the topic was also completed in cooperation with the Commission.

The Department of State requested New Jersey to work with the government of Lithuania to implement education about their history during 1933 – 1945.

Commission members and selected teachers throughout the state worked with Scholastic Magazine to produce two special editions which are still in use today; "The Holocaust" and "Understanding Hate".

2000 – 2007: The network of Holocaust Centers continues to educate teachers and provide leadership in field of Holocaust/genocide education. A new organization, the Council of Holocaust Educators (CHE) is formed to provide the opportunity for teachers to communicate with each other. A survey was conducted as part of doctoral dissertation on Holocaust/genocide education. A school survey was conducted in 2006 to begin to assess the depth of Holocaust/genocide instruction in the classroom.

Formal networking with other Holocaust and related organizations has aided the Commission in its effort to meet the mandate for Holocaust education, specifically with Facing History and Ourselves, United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, Kids Bridge of New Jersey, Heritage Museum in New York, and Yad Vashem in Israel.

1991 – 2007: Every year the Commission coordinates statewide Yom HaShoah and Krystallnacht commemorations and coordinates a seminar for educators to the infamous sites of the Holocaust.

2008 – 2010: New curriculum guides were developed and others initiated.

9/11 Bullying and Terrorism – K-12 grades
Anticipated September 2010

Slavery and Genocide – A cooperative project with the Amistad and Holocaust Commissions. Disseminated to schools during the 2009/10 school year.

2010 – 2011: State Commissions – Development of a cooperative workshop on stereotyping. Native American – Completed curriculum development producing a guide for classroom usage. 9/11 Activities – Completion of a K-12 curriculum guide.

2011 – 2012: Along with many major events, the coordination of a state-wide program that attracted over 400 2nd/3rd generations of the Holocaust to begin transition from direct testimony of survivors to their families.

2012 – 2013: Completed two (2) curriculum guides regarding the “Repressive Regime of Stalin” and “Greece – Prior to, During and After the Holocaust”.

2013 – 2014: Continued program of bringing together students and survivors. To date, 2,500 students have had the experience.

Development of a five (5) year compilation of anniversary dates regarding the Holocaust/Genocide and Civil Rights and a 20 year update of the Rwandan Genocide.

A 20-year celebration of the passage of the Holocaust/Genocide Mandate ended the year.

2014 – 2015: Identified a five (5) year calendar for Krystallnacht and Yom HaShoah programs. Coordination of Holocaust/Genocide lesson plans for students with learning disabilities.

2015 – 2016: Completion and announcement of Holocaust/Genocide lesson plans for students with learning disabilities titled “Teaching about the Holocaust/Genocide, Prejudice & Bullying Using UDL.”

On Nov 18th, Rowan University formally opened their Center for Holocaust & Genocide Studies.

Our plan for bringing the grandchildren of survivors together in order to keep their grandparents’ stories and experiences current was organized and modeled after similar efforts in NY.

On May 20th, Dr. Paul B. Winkler, after a stellar career as an educator, retired as Executive Director of the Commission. Lawrence M. Glaser was named new Executive Director of the Commission. Paul passed away on July 12, 2016.

2016 – 2017: On April 26, 2017 Warren County Community College formally opened their Holocaust/Genocide Resource Center.

On July 19 through August 3, 2017 New Jersey Teachers participated in the annual Summer Seminar to the Infamous Sites of the Holocaust.

On May 16, 2016 Judy Baker from the Division of Learning Supports and Specialized Services, Holocaust Commission, passed away unexpectedly after 20 years with the Holocaust Commission.

2017 – 2018: On October 4, 2018 Saint Peters University formally became a New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education and Genocide Studies Center.

From July 18 through August 2, 2018 The New Jersey teachers participated in the annual Summer Seminar to the Infamous Sites of the Holocaust.

2018 – 2019: From July 17 through August 1, 2019 twenty-six New Jersey teachers participated in the annual Summer Seminar to the Infamous Sites of the Holocaust.
