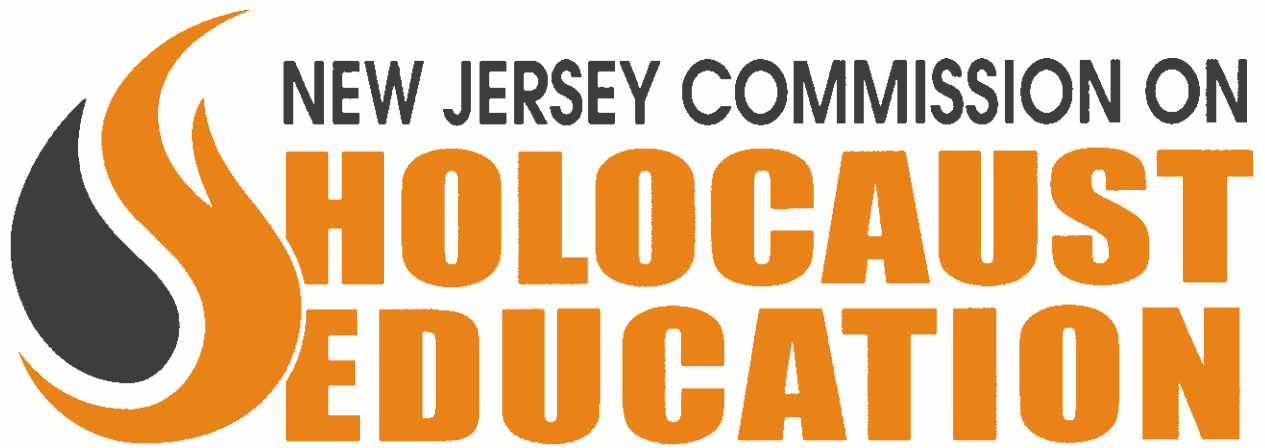
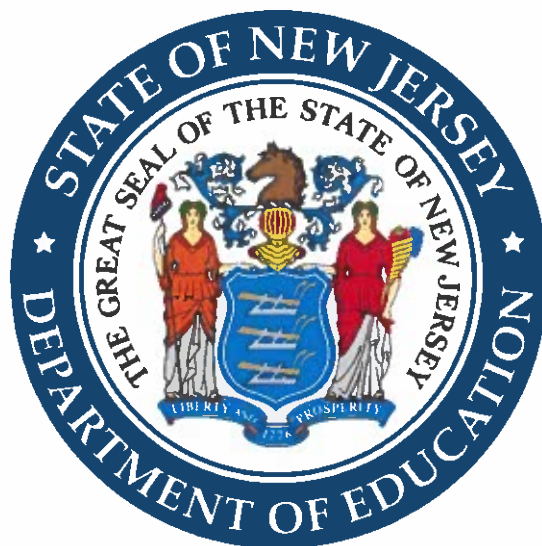

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ADOPTED MARCH 10, 1994

Sponsored by Senators EWING, McGREEVEY and SINAGRA

1 AN ACT regarding genocide education in the public schools and
2 supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey
3 Statutes.

4
5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
6 State of New Jersey:

7 1. The Legislature finds and declares that:

8 a. New Jersey has recently become the focal point of national
9 attention for the most venomous and vile of ethnic hate speeches.

10 b. There is an inescapable link between violence and vandalism
11 and ethnic and racial intolerance. The New Jersey Department
12 of Education itself has formally recognized the existence of the
13 magnitude of this problem in New Jersey schools by the
14 formation of a Commissioner's Task Force on Violence and
15 Vandalism.

16 c. New Jersey is proud of its enormous cultural diversity. The
17 teaching of tolerance must be made a priority if that cultural
18 diversity is to remain one of the State's strengths.

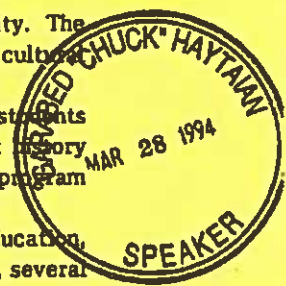
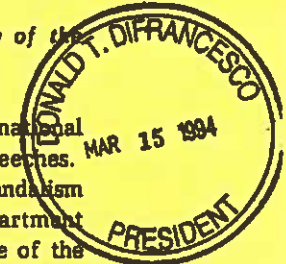
19 d. National studies indicate that fewer than 25% of students
20 have an understanding of organized attempts throughout history
21 to eliminate various ethnic groups through a systematic program
22 of mass killing or genocide.

23 e. The New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education,
24 created pursuant to P.L.1991, c.193 (C.18A:4A-1 et seq.), several
25 years ago expanded its mission to study and recommend
26 curricular material on a wide range of genocides. The Holocaust
27 Commission is an ideal agency to recommend curricular materials
28 to local districts.

29 2. a. Every board of education shall include instruction on the
30 Holocaust and genocides in an appropriate place in the curriculum
31 of all elementary and secondary school pupils.

32 b. The instruction shall enable pupils to identify and analyze
33 applicable theories concerning human nature and behavior; to
34 understand that genocide is a consequence of prejudice and
35 discrimination; and to understand that issues of moral dilemma
36 and conscience have a profound impact on life. The instruction
37 shall further emphasize the personal responsibility that each
38 citizen bears to fight racism and hatred whenever and wherever
39 it happens.

40 3. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply
41 to curriculum offerings in the 1994-95 school year.

9/15/22	Dr. Ashley Jardina: White Grievance Politics. Over the past twenty years, the U.S. has experienced significant demographic change. As the U.S. has become more racially and ethnically diverse, and as people of color have become more visible in positions of social, economic, and political power, many white Americans have felt threatened by these changes. What are their reactions and what are their consequences for race relations, immigration policy, partisan polarization, electoral politics, and more? In this talk, Dr. Ashley Jardina drew on her own research to help us understand how white grievance has become central to national politics, with alarming consequences for the future of our democracy.	21	10	2	23
10/12/22	Dr. Joshua Kavaloski: Graphic Adaptations of Anne Frank's Life and Diary. Anne Frank is arguably the best known victim of the Holocaust, and her life and diary have served as inspiration for four graphic novels. This talk explored the different artistic and narrative approaches of these works. Although they treat similar material, these graphic novels each have individual aesthetic and ideological strategies. Dr. Kavaloski is a professor of German at Drew University where he also directs the Center for Holocaust/Genocide Study.	22	6	0	24
11/9/22	Dr. Monica Strauss: From Hearsay to History: Uncovering a Jewish Family's Life in Pre-War Austria and Poland (In Commemoration of <i>Kristallnacht</i>). Crossing Germany on the way home from a business trip on November 11, 1938, Oscar Spitzer, 34, saw the widespread destruction of <i>Kristallnacht</i> with his own eyes. He immediately grasped the implications for his Jewish family in Polish Silesia. Four days after arriving home, he went to the English consulate in Katowice and got a British exit visa good for one year. Visas for his wife and parents followed soon after. His foresight enabled them to escape to England in August 1939, just two weeks before the German invasion of Poland. Discovering this crucial chronology in her father's Polish passport several years after his death, Monica Strauss realized how superficial her knowledge of her parents' pre-war lives had been. In 2010, when she embarked on serious research into her background, she decided to document her discoveries in a blog titled refugeetales.com .	5	13	5	21

2/7/23	<p>Nechama Birnbaum: The Redhead of Auschwitz: A True Story. Rosie was always told her red hair was a curse, but she never believed it. She often dreamed what it would look like under a white veil with the man of her dreams by her side. However, her life takes a harrowing turn in 1944 when she is forced out of her home and sent to the most gruesome of places: Auschwitz. Upon arrival, Rosie's head is shaved and along with the loss of her beautiful hair, she loses the life she once cherished. Among the chaos and surrounded by hopelessness, Rosie realizes the only thing the Nazis cannot take away from her is the fierce redhead resilience in her spirit. When all of her friends conclude they are going to heaven from Auschwitz, she remains determined to get home. She summons all of her courage, through death camps and death marches to do just that. This victorious biography, written by Nechama Birnbaum in honor of her grandmother, is as full of life as it is of death. It is about the intricacies of Jewish culture that still exist today and the tender experiences that are universal to all humanity: family, coming of age, and first love. In this lecture, Dr. Simon discussed the importance and role of diary writing for Jewish victims during the Holocaust. She focused on diaries written in Yiddish in the Warsaw, Lodz, and Vilna ghettos, emphasizing why people wrote, what they wrote about, how they preserved their writings, and what these sources can tell us about victim experiences and emotions during the Holocaust.</p>	10	10	6	22
3/22/23	<p>Dr. Kathryn Sederberg: Bearing Witness: Diary Writing in WWII and the Holocaust (Part Two of Three of the Study Seminar, "Diaries and the Holocaust.") Jews throughout Europe continued to write diaries during the 1930s and 40s, whether in hiding, imprisoned in ghettos, or even in concentration and death camps. While many of these authors would not survive the Holocaust, some writers were able to find refuge through emigration, taking their diary with them. This presentation provided an overview of the practices of diary writing during the Second World War, with a focus on the diaries written by the survivors of Nazi persecution who emigrated in the late 1930s. By analyzing specific diaries in detail, we can see how writers felt a need to document and bear witness to the historical events around them, while also preserving a sense of self.</p>	12	16	4	26

Dr. Edmund Kessler was a lawyer in Lvov, Poland, until he got caught up in the Holocaust. From 1942 to 1944, he kept a vivid eyewitness diary which describes his many dramatic experiences in the Lvov Ghetto and a concentration camp as well as in an underground bunker where he and other Jews survived by being hidden by a Polish farmer and his family.</p>	6	10	5	17

4/24/23	<p>Tova Friedman: Surviving Auschwitz. In commemoration of Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day). Tova Friedman is one of the youngest people to survive Auschwitz concentration camp. She was born in 1938 in northern Poland near the city of Gdansk. After the onset of WWII, she and her family were first forced to live in a ghetto and then in a work camp. In June 1944, she and her mother were transported to the extermination camp Auschwitz-Birkenau, where she survived several close calls with death. She and her mother were liberated by Soviet troops in January 1945. They were later reunited with her father, and in 1950, the family emigrated to the US, where she earned two MAs and eventually became a social worker and administrator and therapist. The Holocaust Resource Center of Kean University had a wonderful academic year and commemorated its 40th anniversary. For 2022-23, 41 school districts participated in the ID 1800 dual-credit high school program. There were 31 course sections with a total number of 564 enrolled students. The HRC's Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Teaching the Holocaust and Teaching Prejudice Reduction had 163 students enrolled in 7 sections of the introductory courses and 5 sections of the advanced seminar. The HRC proudly upheld its status as one of 13 nationally-recognized Jewish Foundation for the Righteous (JFR) Holocaust Center of Excellence. Five educators attended 2023 Advanced Seminar, including the HRC's assistant director, and two educators attended the 2023 Summer Institute for Teachers.

The Holocaust Resource Center held numerous conferences, workshops, and community programs. The HRC's director and assistant director implemented a new presentation on antisemitism, which was delivered to 2,725 middle and high school students. The HRC had more than 600 lead district teachers attend three General Assembly Meetings and 2,401 elementary, middle, and high school students at the two Student Leadership Conferences. The HRC had 10,564 attendees for our Holocaust commemorations: *Kristallnacht*/November Pogrom, IHRD, Yom HaShoah, and Murray Pantirer Annual Scholars' Lecture. For Holocaust and Genocide Awareness Month (April 2023), the HRC had 1,800 attendees at various programs. The HRC submitted a proposal for \$1,000 to the Mark Schonwetter Holocaust Education Foundation to support an International Holocaust Remembrance Day program, in collaboration with Clark Public Schools, which was funded. The HRC hosted various programs in partnership with other New Jersey centers and likeminded organizations including the Holocaust Council of Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest NJ, Saint Elizabeth University, Raritan Valley Community College, Mercer County Holocaust, Genocide & Human Rights Education Center, Bergen County Community College, William Paterson University Center for Holocaust & Genocide Studies, 3GNJ, JCC of Central New Jersey, and more.

The HRC collaborated with national and international like-minded institutions. The HRC became a Conference on Holocaust Education Centers partner with the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. The HRC presented "*Playing Anne Frank: A Limited Series Podcast in Conversation with Adam Langer and Shana Stein*" with *The Forward*. The HRC hosted the presentation "*Never Again in Practice: Auschwitz Jewish Center's Response to the War in Ukraine*" with the Auschwitz Jewish Center (Poland). The HRC also continued their relationship with History Unfolded (USHMM), Facing History and Ourselves, Jewish Partisan Educational Foundation, Museum of Jewish Heritage, the American Society for Yad Vashem, Centropa, and more.

Introduction

Strategies for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 aimed at: (1) developing a formal relationship with The College of New Jersey that has a Holocaust & Genocide Studies minor but no Center; (2) increase reach and community engagement through increased partnerships with other New Jersey Centers; and (3) continue to ensure our Advisory Commission reflects the composition of the community and represents marginalized voices.

Relationship with The College of New Jersey

Meetings with MCCC and TCNJ administration generated many ideas for collaboration, including suitcasing TCNJ's HGS 200 Genocide & Human Rights to MCCC. Ultimately, though, it came down to funding and TCNJ stated it needed to raise the necessary \$2,000 to co-sponsor the Center. A financial arrangement has now been tabled. However, we have extended an invitation for a TCNJ faculty member, Dr. Cynthia Paces of the history department, to join our Advisory Commission.

Despite advertising, we had no TCNJ interns during this academic year. However, we were able to secure William Paterson University interns who conducted oral history interviews and prepared annotated bibliographies for selected programs. At the present time, there is no intern for Fall 2023 and the previous interns, who continued to manage our social media as volunteers, have moved on to other opportunities. Previous attempts to leverage MCCC's work/study program were not successful.

Increased Community Engagement

Although our Center successfully broadened its strategic collaborations beyond William Paterson University and Raritan Valley Community College to now include Saint Elizabeth University, Kean University, and Bergen County Community College, we witnessed a significant drop in Zoom attendance, far less than the number of registrants. That said, the cost-sharing benefits of co-sponsored programs enabled us to attract high-level talent, including Dr. Taner Akçam, the first Turkish scholar to acknowledge the Armenian Genocide.

The Center hosted nine (9) virtual events during the academic year for a total number of 222 attendees, less than half of last year's attendance. Given the low turnout despite featuring top-drawer academics and researchers, our strategy will shift in 2023-2024 toward more practical programs such as a best-class practice workshop for grade 4-12 educators, and an art exhibit at MCCC with opportunities for creative writing and fundraising.

We continue to maintain our two mailing lists: an opt-in list based on program registration (482 vs. 671 last year) and a curated list of county language arts and social studies educators (222 vs 233 last year). This significant drop suggests we either need to change our programming and/or reinstate in-

person events due to possible Zoom fatigue. Without an intern, however, we are hard-pressed to use our own lists and will rely on MCCC's communications staff and vehicles.

Advisory Commission Expansion

We were not able to add a Latinx voice to our Advisory Commission and other diverse voices we added in the previous year have found other priorities. Five members of our Commission have completed their terms as of June 30, 2023. MCCC is revising its Commission procedures and once that's in place by mid-fall, we can appoint and reappoint members.

Other Highlights

I have transferred ownership of my Holocaust Kidlit database to the State of New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education. I participated in the creation of the new state curriculum and attended NJEA to assist with the rollout.

Looking Toward 2023-2024

We will be making changes to our strategies in 2023-2024 to focus on county educators, provide professional development credit, and deliver programs (most likely fewer) for greater impact.

New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education Summary
Report from Michelle Edgar, Program Specialist for The
Institute of Holocaust and Genocide Studies at Raritan
Valley Community College 2023

The fall & winter of 2022 and the spring & summer of 2023 have been very exciting at Raritan Valley Community College's Institute of Holocaust and Genocide Studies. Through our diverse programs and exhibitions, we have reached students, faculty, educators, neighbors, and an international community of scholars seeking more diverse stories and voices.

Our Summer Book Series continued in 2022 with discussions about the Syrian Refugee crisis as we delved into the novel *The Map of Salt & Stars* by Zeyn Joukhadar. We discussed what "Passing" meant in the historical fiction novel *The Personal Librarian*. Some other highlights included *The Light from the Yellow Star Art Exhibition* and corresponding workshops highlighting the work of Holocaust survivor Robert Fisch.

We watched thought-provoking films such as *The Shoah Ambassadors* and *Rebuilt from Broken Glass* and spoke with the directors of these films. We had extraordinary authors such as Tova Friedman, Ely Fischman, Cara-Wilson Granat, and Jennifer Rosner join us to discuss their books.

We engaged students in the 5th grade and up with the opportunity to hear from the Montreal Holocaust Museum's lead curator, Dr. Fourcade, to learn how one becomes a museum curator and why it is such an important job. These students had the opportunity to have a discussion with Dr. Fourcade about the importance of learning history and its impact on our world today.

We coordinated opportunities for students and the wider community to hear directly from survivors of genocides both online and in-person while hosting our community-wide Kristallnacht Commemoration, Our Holocaust Remembrance Day Event, Yom HaShoah, and Learning Through Experience. Holocaust survivors Maud Dahme, Mark Schonwetter, Tova Friedman, Fred Behrend, and Serbian genocide survivor Nadja Halibegovich offered personal accounts and helped humanize these tragedies.

We had guest lecturer Dr. Ellen Kennedy talk about current-day genocides in her five-week series. Dr. Kennedy provided a historical context while offering insight into the present-day conflicts that are taking place on every continent.

We collaborated with organizations locally, nationally, and internationally to offer meaningful webinars and in-person events. Our partners included The New Jersey Commission on Holocaust Education, our RVCC Department of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, The Jewish Federation of West-Central New Jersey, The JCC Holocaust Memorial Education Center, The Shimon and Sara Birnbaum JCC, Jewish Family Service of Somerset, Hunterdon, and Warren Counties, 3GNJ, 3GNY, and 3GPhilly Descendants of Holocaust Survivor organizations, and The Montreal Holocaust Museum. Working with these organizations has been immensely helpful as we coordinate educational, informative, timely, and inspiring programs.
