

Holocaust/Genocide graduate certificate overview:

- 15-credit, one year program
- Courses offered late afternoons/evenings in 14 week sessions
- Meets N.J. educational guidelines for Holocaust education in grades K-12
- Provides educators with knowledge, strategies and resources for curriculum development, teaching and assessment
- Enhances the ability of librarians and museum professionals to support Holocaust education

Graduates will be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge and critical understanding of the Holocaust
- Apply Raphael Lemkin's definition of genocide to the Holocaust and contemporary genocides
- Provide examples of state, national, and international efforts to document, resist, and combat prejudice, racism, anti-Semitism, bullying, hate crimes, and contemporary genocides
- Develop awareness of the role and impact of theology, philosophy, and ethics for dealing with the Holocaust and other genocides as well as inter-religious dialogue
- Identify the role of culture before, during, and after the Holocaust and other genocides
- Develop curricula for teaching about the Holocaust and genocide for meeting the New Jersey mandate for K-12 Holocaust/genocide education

Core Courses to be taught by leaders in the field of Holocaust/Genocide education:

- History of the Holocaust
- Genocide and Human Rights in Modern History
- Teaching the Holocaust and Genocide
- Theology, Philosophy and Ethics of the Holocaust
- The Holocaust and Genocide in Culture
