GARY BARBER : ORDER OF REVOCATION

At its meeting of February 21, 2002, the State Board of Examiners reviewed information received from the Division of Criminal Justice indicating that on November 16, 2000, Gary Barber had pled guilty to charges of endangering the welfare of a child. On January 19, 2001, Barber was sentenced to three years' incarceration, fined, ordered to undergo DNA testing and to comply with the provisions of Megan's Law. Barber is currently the holder of a Teacher of Biological Science certificate issued in April 1981, a Teacher of Agriculture certificate issued in December 1981 and a Teacher of Vocational Education certificate issued in December 1981. Upon review of the above information, at that February meeting, the State Board of Examiners voted to issue Barber an Order to Show Cause.

The Board sent Barber the Order to Show Cause by regular and certified mail on April 8, 2002. The Order provided that Barber's Answer must be filed within 20 days. On April 26, 2002, his attorney filed a letter indicating that he would file a submission on Barber's behalf opposing the Order within the next few weeks. On March 7, 2003, the Board sent Barber's attorney a letter indicating that he had not filed a submission responding to the Order and allowing him an additional ten days to do so. No response has been filed by Barber or on his behalf.

The threshold issue before the State Board of Examiners in this matter, therefore, is whether Barber's guilty plea to endangering the welfare of a child constitutes conduct unbecoming a certificate holder. Since Barber did not respond to the Order to Show Cause, the State Board of Examiners had no responsive pleading to consider in the hearing process. It is therefore ORDERED that the charges in the Order to Show Cause are deemed admitted for the purpose of this proceeding. N.J.A.C. 6:11-3.6(a)1. Since Barber's conduct, which was predicated on the

same conviction as was set forth in the Order to Show Cause, is admitted, the Board of

Examiners must now decide whether that constitutes a sufficient basis to act against his certificates

pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6:11-3.6(a)1. We find that it does.

The State Board of Examiners may revoke or suspend the certification of any certificate

holder on the basis of demonstrated inefficiency, incapacity, conduct unbecoming a teacher or other

just cause. N.J.A.C. 6:11-3.4. Furthermore, unfitness to hold a position in a school system may be

shown by one incident, if sufficiently flagrant. Redcay v. State Board of Education, 130 N.J.L. 369,

371 (S. Ct. 1943), aff'd. 131 N.J.L. 326 (E & A 1944). "Teachers... are professional employees to

whom the people have entrusted the care and custody of ... school children. This heavy duty

requires a degree of self-restraint and controlled behavior rarely requisite to other types of

employment." Tenure of Sammons, 1972 S.L.D. 302, 321. There can be no dispute that Barber's

criminal conviction for endangering the welfare of a child negates any claim she can have to being a

role model for students. Moreover, Barber's acts are inexcusable for any individual, teacher or not.

Thus, the only proper response to Barber's breach is revocation.

Accordingly, it is therefore ORDERED that Gary Barber's Teacher of Biological Science,

Teacher of Agriculture and Teacher of Vocational Education certificates be revoked on this 8th day

of May 2003. It is further ORDERED that Barber return his certificates to the Secretary of the State

Board of Examiners, Office of Licensing, PO Box 500, Trenton, NJ 08625-0500 within 15 days of

receipt of this decision.
