State Board of Education Recognizes GloucesterCounty Student

The State Board of Education today recognized Nina Camaioni, a junior at Williamstown High School, as its March student of the month.

Camaioni is a standout student athlete. She ranks eighth in her class of 437 students and is a star volleyball player on the Williamstown squad. Last fall, she was named the Star-Ledger's New Jersey Girls' Volleyball Player of the Year, and the Courier-Post's South Jersey Girls' Volleyball Player of the Year for the second consecutive year.

"Nina Camaioni, from her impressive academic and athletic record, is an extremely well-rounded student," said State Board of Education President Arnold G. Hyndman. "We are honored to recognize her today, and hope she will continue to be a good role model for students in not only Williamstown High School, but for students throughout the state."

Each month during the school year, the State Board of Education honors a student or group of students from a county in New Jersey to recognize academic excellence. In February, the State Board of Education recognized Sara Steele, a senior at West Milford High School in Passaic County.
