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DOE to Host Data Workshop Next Week

Educators interested in using school data to improve classroom instruction and student results are strongly encouraged to attend a workshop on Tuesday, April 25 in Wayne.

The workshop, "Drilling Down Using Data," is co-sponsored by the Department of Education's Northern Regional Office and Passaic County Community College. It takes place from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Passaic County Public Safety Academy, 300 Oldham Road, Wayne.

Dr. Tracey Severns is the keynote speaker. She is currently the Mount Olive Middle School principal and is a former superintendent. She has presented at various state and national education workshops from the perspective of a teacher, parent, student, private tutor, researcher, vice principal, principal and superintendent.

Dr. Severns has a bachelor's degree in Psychology, a master's degree in Teaching and a doctorate in Educational Administration and Supervision. She is certified in Elementary Education, Special Education and K-12 Administration.
