State Board of Education Recognizes October Student of the Month

Kelsey Von Tish, a senior at Hunterdon Central Regional High School and president of her school's math honor society, was honored today by the State Board of Education as the October Student of the Month.

Kelsey is the May 2006 recipient of her school's Excellence in Mathematics Award and is in the top 1 percent of her class. She is involved with her school's ski club, plays both acoustic and electric guitar, and is a member of both the math and Spanish honor societies.
