#### Convening

State Board of Education President Kathy Goldenberg convened the public meeting at 9:15 a.m. with the reading of the statement pertaining to the public session of the State Board meeting as it complies with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act.

# **President's Reports**

# **Public Testimony**

President Goldenberg stated that for the month of May, the State Board will receive open topic public testimony, in addition to testimony on the proposed amendments to Chapter 12, Interdistrict Public School Choice. For the month of June, the State Board will receive public testimony on the Regulatory and Waiver Code and Chapter 23A, Fiscal Accountability, Efficiency and Budgeting Procedures (subchapters 16-22).

# Welcome of the Permanent Student Representative

President Goldenberg introduced the State Board of Education's permanent student representative, Miss Nilanjana (Nillie) Ghosh. Miss Ghosh is a rising junior at West Windsor Plainsboro High School North.

Ms. Nilanjana Ghosh (Nillie) spoke about the end of year celebrations happening in the schools by way of the Student Council. She introduced the incoming student representative, Anna Paszkiewicz, a junior at Palmyra High School in Burlington County and her advisor, Ms. Kelly Jones.

#### **Resolution in Recognition of Physical Fitness and Sport Month in New Jersey**

President Goldenberg requested that the State Board adopt a ceremonial Resolution in Recognition of Physical Fitness and Sport Month in New Jersey. The State Board unanimously adopted the following resolution read by Mary Beth Berry recognizing the Physical Fitness and Sport Month in New Jersey.

#### **Resolution in Recognition of Physical Education Fitness and Sports Month in New Jersey**

Whereas, childhood obesity has reached epidemic proportions in the United States; and

Whereas, today's childhood obesity rates are putting our children on course to be the first generation in this country to live shorter and less healthy lives than their parents; and

Whereas, children spend many of their waking hours on their devices or at school, and therefore need to be active during the school day to meet the recommendations of the Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans; and

**Whereas,** the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services recommends that young people aged 6–17 years participate in at least 60 minutes of physical activity daily; and

**Whereas,** N.J.S.A. 18A:35-7 and 8 require all students in grades 1-12 to participate in at least two and one-half hours per week in health, safety and physical education; and

Whereas, research shows that physically active children are more likely to thrive academically and have improved behavior in school; and

Whereas, research shows that regular physical activity in childhood and adolescence improves strength and endurance, helps build healthy bones and muscles, helps control weight, reduces depression, anxiety and stress, increases self-esteem, increases academic performance, improves behavior, leads to better school attendance and may improve blood pressure and cholesterol levels; and

Whereas, schools can promote physical activity through comprehensive school physical activity programs, including recess, classroom-based physical activity, intramural physical activity clubs, interscholastic sports, and physical education; and

Whereas, participation in sports teams and physical activity clubs can improve grade point average, school attachment, educational aspirations, and the likelihood of graduation; and

Whereas, higher physical fitness levels are associated with better school attendance rates and fewer disciplinary incidents involving drugs, alcohol, violence or truancy; and

Whereas, the New Jersey State Board of Education strongly supports efforts to increase physical education, physical activity and participation in youth sports, recognizes the month of May as National Physical Education and Sports Month; now therefore be it

**Resolved,** that the New Jersey State Board of Education and Acting Commissioner of Education acknowledge the week of May 1-7, 2024, as National Physical Education and Sports

Week and recognize National Physical Fitness and Sports Month and the central role of physical education and sports in creating a healthy lifestyle for all children in the State of New Jersey.

President Goldenberg stated that Mr. Bruce Peragallo, Executive Director of the New Jersey Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance (NJAHPERD), is here today to accept the resolution and to say a few words.

#### Selection of the State Board Nominating Committee

President Goldenberg announced the members of the State Board Nominating Committee. She stated Mary Beth Berry will serve as Chair of the committee and State Board members Arcelio Aponte and Elaine Bobrove will serve on the committee. She stated the committee will present the slate of officers for the 2024-2025 school year at the June 5, 2024 meeting and in accordance with the bylaws the elections for the State Board leadership will be held after June 30.

#### **State Board Committee Reports**

#### **Policy Committee**

Elaine Bobrove, chair of the Policy committee, stated that the committee met on April 24, 2024. She stated they discussed the readoption with amendments of Chapter 5, Regulatory Equivalency and Waiver.

She stated this chapter lives in the State Board Office and grants the Commissioner the authority to provide some flexibility to regulations, except for the certification rules (Chapter 9s) and special education rules (Chapter 14). She further stated this chapter is very technical in nature and the amendments are not big policy changes. Ms. Bobrove stated the proposal is on today's agenda at first discussion, so she will forgo providing a full report.
