## **CONVENING**

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey State Board of Education recognizes that learning to become effective users of information and ideas is an essential skill for students as they prepare for a future characterized by change; and

**WHEREAS,** school libraries provide materials that will develop literary, cultural, aesthetic appreciation, and ethical standards; and

**WHEREAS,** school libraries foster personalized learning experiences for students by providing collaborative work spaces and an environment conducive to reading and learning, creative expression, investigation and research, professional growth, and curriculum development and enhancement; and

**WHEREAS**, school libraries promote both excellence and equity in education through the variety of educational resources and instruction provided by the school library program; and

**WHEREAS,** school librarians instruct students with the information skills necessary to think critically, draw conclusions, make informed decisions, and create and share knowledge in preparation for lifelong learning as well as adult decision making and citizenship; and

**WHEREAS**, it is both fitting and proper that special recognition be given to school library programs and the role of certified school librarians in education throughout the state of New Jersey; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the New Jersey State Board of Education and the Commissioner of Education recognize April 2018 as School Library Month in New Jersey.

# \*D. Resolution to Revise the Timeline for edTPA Qualifying Cut Scores for Novice Teachers to Receive Certification

• Adopted the following resolution to extend setting cut scores for the novice teachers to receive certification by one academic year, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-8.2(a)6, N.J.A.C. 6A:9A-5.5(a)2, N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-8.8 and N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-8.7(a)4.

# A RESOLUTION TO REVISE THE TIMELINE FOR edTPA QUALIFYING CUT SCORES FOR NOVICE TEACHERS TO RECEIVE CERTIFICATION

**WHEREAS,** the State Board of Education adopted a resolution on August 3, 2016 that established the cut score and handbook alignment for the Commissioner-approved performance assessment edTPA in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:9B-8.7(a)4i; and

WHEREAS, the State Board of Education resolution permitted the Department to study flexibility options for candidates completing the Commissioner-approved performance assessment; and

WHEREAS, the Department is in the process of collecting and analyzing qualitative and quantitative edTPA data for New Jersey novice teachers and does not yet have enough data on the performance of Certificate of Eligibility (alternate-route) candidates to make an accurate assessment of what an appropriate cut score would be, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, that the State Board of Education hereby recommends extending setting cut scores by one academic year, to expire on August 31, 2020, at which point a New Jersey-specific standard setting conducted on or before June 1, 2020 will be used to determine a higher cut score; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that completing the assessment shall satisfy all relevant regulatory requirements from September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2019; and be it further

**RESOLVED** that a cut score of 44 on the combined elementary assessment, a cut score of 32 on the world and classical languages assessment, and a cut score of 37 on all other assessments will be acceptable from September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020 to satisfy all relevant regulatory requirements.

## E. Religious Holidays Calendar Resolution

• Discussed the following resolution pertaining to the annual calendar of religious holidays for the 2018-2019 school year as established at N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3(j), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:36-14-16.

# RESOLUTION THE LIST OF RELIGIOUS HOLIDAYS PERMITTING STUDENT ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

**WHEREAS**, according to N.J.S.A. 18A:36-14 through 16 and N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3(j), regarding student absence from school because of religious holidays, the Commissioner of Education, with the approval of the State Board of Education, is charged with the responsibility of prescribing such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of the law; and

## WHEREAS, the law provides that:

- 1. Any student absent from school because of a religious holiday may not be deprived of any award or of eligibility or opportunity to compete for any award because of such absence;
- 2. Students who miss a test or examination because of absence on a religious holiday must be given the right to take an alternate test or examination;
- 3. To be entitled to the privileges set forth above, the student must present a written excuse signed by a parent or person standing in place of a parent;
- 4. Any absence because of a religious holiday must be recorded in the school register or in any group or class attendance record as an excused absence;
- 5. Such absence must not be recorded on any transcript or application or employment form or on any similar form; and
- 6. The Commissioner, with the approval of the State Board of Education, is required to:
- (a) prescribe such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this act; and
- (b) prepare a list of religious holidays on which it shall be mandatory to excuse a student. The list, however, is to be a minimum list. Boards of education, at their discretion, may add other days to the list for the schools of their districts; and

**WHEREAS**, although the New Jersey Department of Education makes every attempt to ensure the accuracy of the dates using the lunar, Gregorian and Julian calendars; and

**WHEREAS**, dates within this resolution may not be fixed before the State Board adopts the annual calendar and may require additional revision; now therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, the State Board of Education permits the Commissioner of Education, after annual adoption by the State Board of Education, to revise the dates provided in list of religious holidays.

**WHEREAS**, the district board of education has the right to add any bona fide religious holiday to the list for its own schools; now therefore be it,

**RESOLVED** that the State Board of Education adopts the following list of religious holidays for the 2018 - 2019 school year:
